Roll west through remote mountain passes to the **cobbled charm of Villafranca del Bierzo** and the legendary **Santiago de Compostela**.

After a rest day, ride east through **León and the lush Cantabrian hills**, then climb high into the untamed **Pyrenees**. From the tiny mountain outpost of **Larrau**, loop through the **French-Spanish borderlands** before descending into the coastal cool of **San Sebastián and Bilbao**. With each day delivering a fresh mix of **epic roads, rustic villages, and cultural gems**, you'll return to Santander full of stories — and ready for your **next Wild Roads escape**.

INTRODUCTION



Welcome to **Wild Roads** — where the ride is as unforgettable as the destination.

This two-week adventure loops through some of the most spectacular riding regions in **northern Spain** and southern France — a proper mix of **mountains, coast, culture, and twisty roads**, all handpicked for riders who want more than just the average tour.

The tour finishes with a final blast along the **Atlantic** before boarding the ferry home.

FERRY: PLYMOUTH - SANTANDER

DAY 1

Start Location: Plymouth (UK)

End Location: Overnight Ferry to Santander

Distance: Approx: N/A (travel day)

Highlights:

- Meet the group at Plymouth ferry port
- Time to relax with a coffee before departure
- First introductions with fellow riders
- Boarding the overnight ferry to Spain
- Comfortable cabin and evening at sea



The adventure begins in Plymouth, where we meet at the ferry terminal around two hours before departure. There's no rush — just time to grab a tea or coffee, get to know the group, and soak in that pre-trip buzz as everyone arrives.

This is where it all starts — stories, bikes, and the shared excitement of the road ahead.

As boarding opens, we roll the bikes onto the ferry and get settled in for the night. With everything stowed, it's time to relax and enjoy the crossing — whether that's a good meal, a drink with the group, or simply heading out on deck to watch the coastline fade into the distance.

A comfortable night onboard sets the tone perfectly.

Tomorrow, we arrive in Spain... and the riding begins.

SANTANDER TO MUNGIA

DAY 2

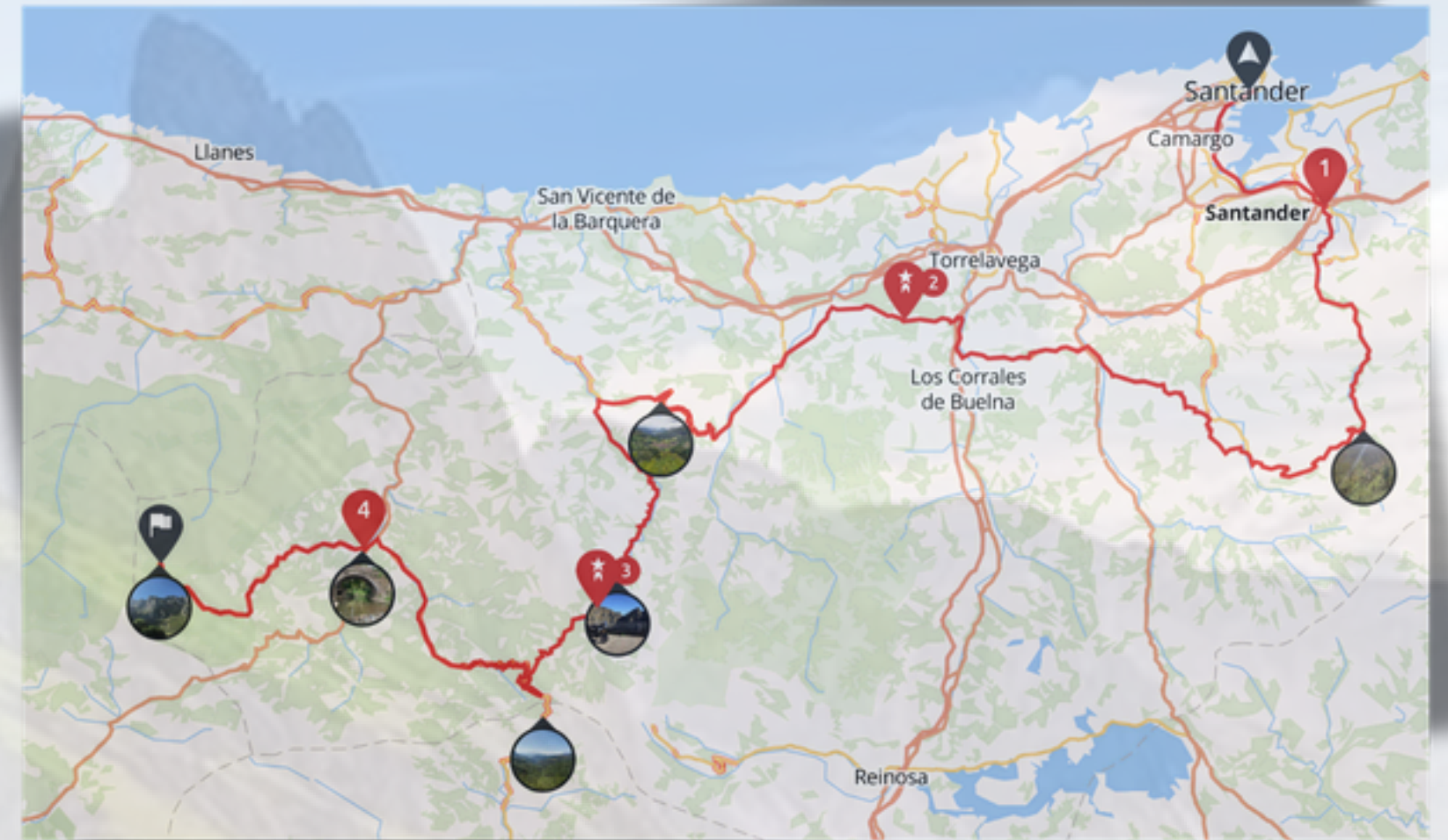
Start Location: Santander

End Location: Mungia [Near Bilbao]

Distance: Approx: 160–80 miles (short warm-up ride)

Highlights:

- Ferry arrival into Santander
- First ride on Spanish tarmac
- Gentle introduction to northern Spain's riding style
- Scenic hills near Bilbao
- Hotel stay with views toward the Picos Mountains



After a relaxed overnight crossing, we roll off the ferry into Santander at around 5:30pm. With the sun still hanging in the sky, it's the perfect moment to fire up the bikes and get that first taste of Spanish roads.

Today is intentionally short — just enough to get the engines warm, shake off the ferry legs, and ease into the rhythm of riding again. From the port, we head west briefly before cutting inland, climbing into the green, rolling hills that surround Bilbao. The roads here are a teaser for what's to come — smooth tarmac, flowing bends, and just enough twist to remind you why you're here.

By early evening, we arrive in Mungia, where we settle into a high-quality hotel perched in a peaceful spot overlooking the distant Picos Mountains. It's a cracking place to unwind, grab a good meal, and soak in that first proper evening of the trip. This is just the warm-up.

Tomorrow... the real adventure begins.

MUNGIA - FUENTE DÉ

DAY 3

Start Location: Mungia

End Location: Fuente Dé

Distance: Approx: 150 miles

Highlights:

- First full day of riding
- Flowing Basque country roads
- Climbing into the Cantabrian Mountains
- Entering the Picos de Europa
- Iconic ride into Fuente Dé

Today is where it really begins.

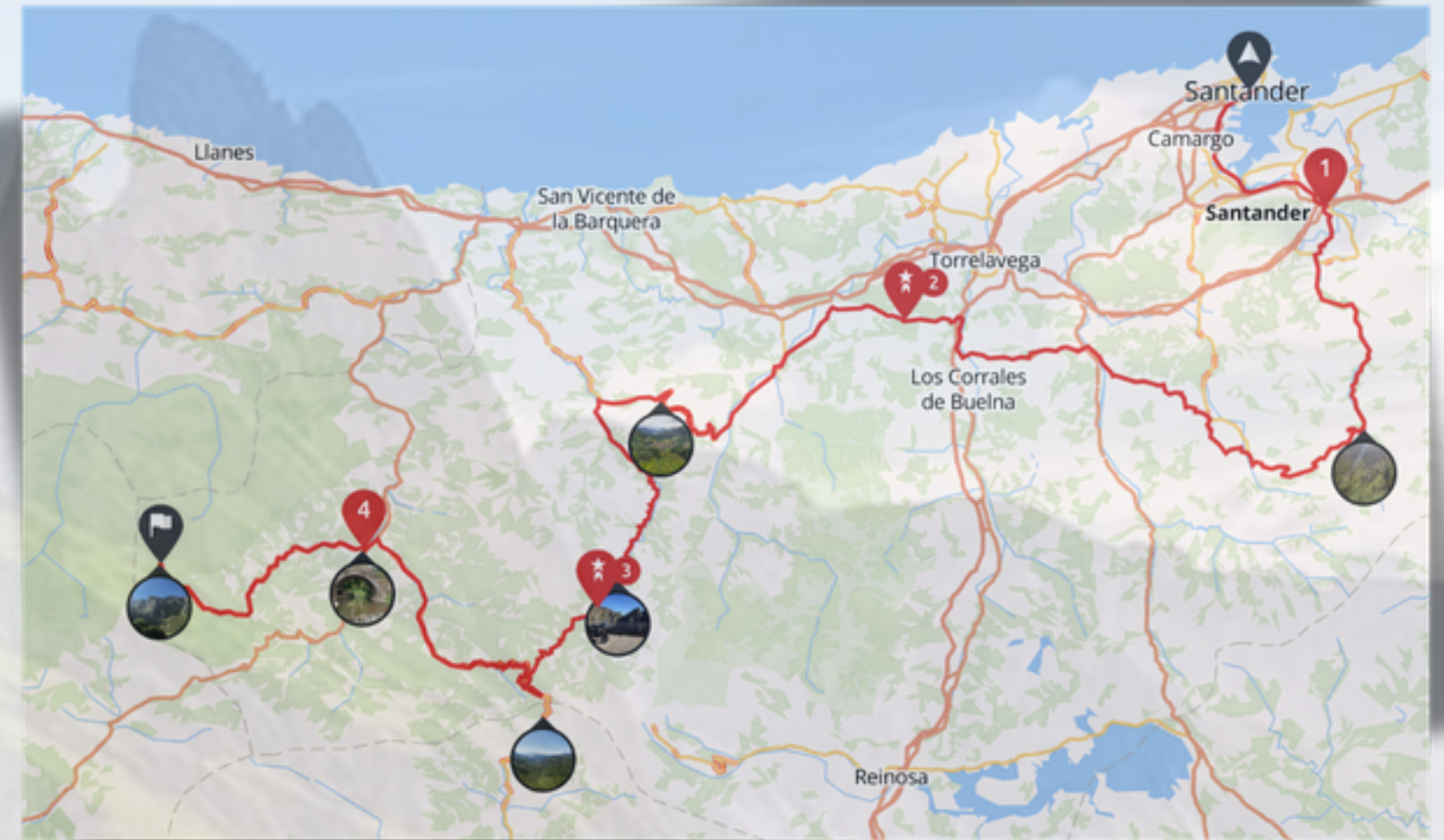
After yesterday's gentle warm-up, we head out from Mungia ready to dive properly into the rhythm of the road. The morning starts with smooth, flowing routes through the Basque countryside — quiet, green, and a perfect way to build momentum. As the miles roll on, the landscape begins to shift. The roads tighten, the elevation rises, and before long, we're carving our way into the wild beauty of the Cantabrian Mountains.

This is proper riding.

By early afternoon, we enter the Picos de Europa — one of Spain's most breathtaking mountain regions. Towering limestone peaks, deep valleys, and endless sweeping bends make this a day to remember.

The final stretch into Fuente Dé is something special. The road winds its way through dramatic scenery before opening up to one of the most iconic mountain backdrops of the entire tour.

We roll into our mountain retreat, tucked beneath the peaks — the perfect place to relax, take it all in, and enjoy that feeling of this is exactly why we came.



FUENTE DÉ TO VILLAFRANCA DEL BIERZO

DAY 4

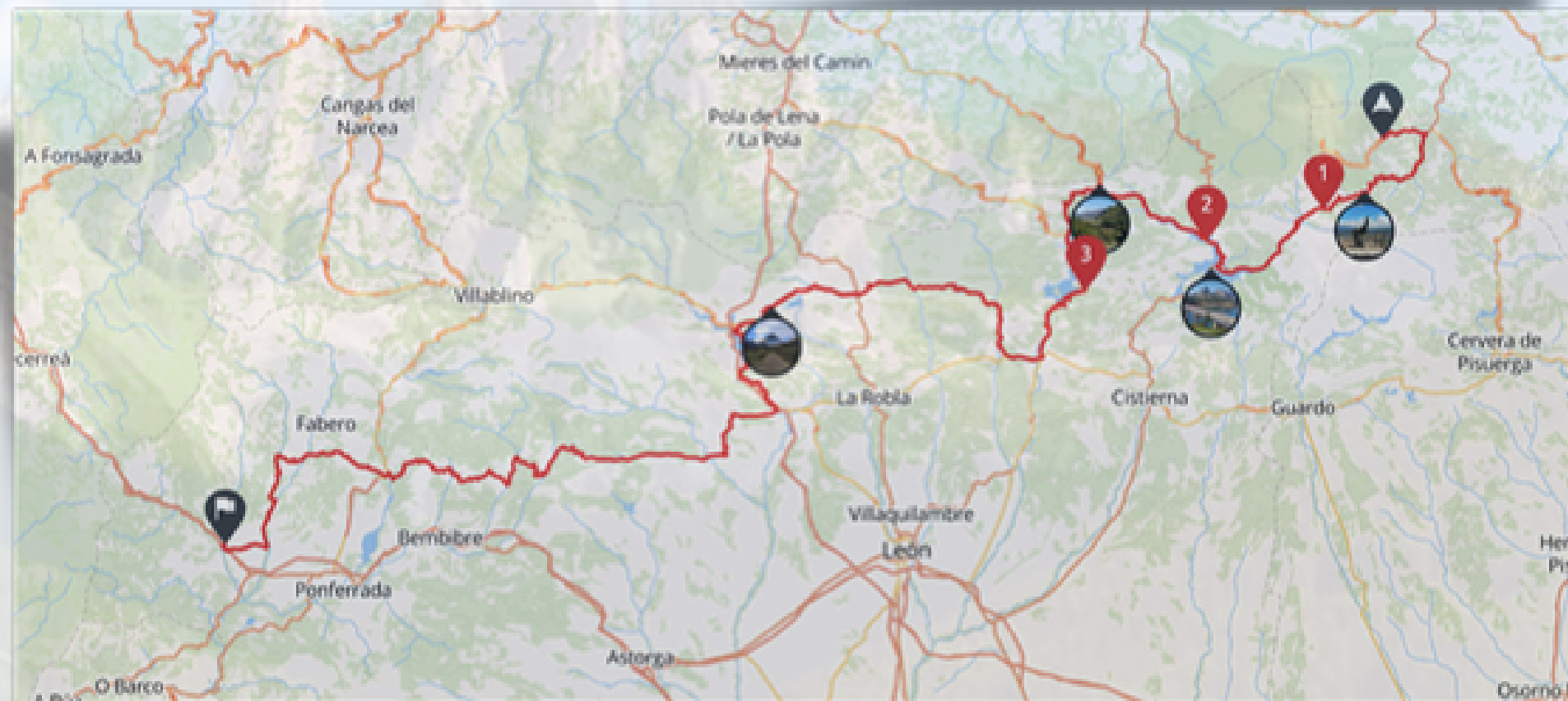
Start Location: Fuente Dé

End Location: Villafranca del Bierzo

Distance: Approx: 190 Miles

Highlights:

- Sweeping bends through Spain's remote green heart
- Pine forests, valleys, and peaceful rural villages
- Ride into the Bierzo wine region of Galicia
- Authentic medieval charm of Villafranca del Bierzo
- Optional glass of local Mencía red to end the day



Leaving behind the dramatic alpine backdrop of Fuente Dé, we drop out of the high peaks and start our journey west into the wild green heart of Spain. The day unfolds as a glorious mix of flowing bends, pine forests, and remote valleys, far from the beaten tourist trail.

This is northern Spain at its purest — winding roads that carve through untouched landscapes, sleepy hamlets where time stands still, and endless riding satisfaction.

As we approach Villafranca del Bierzo, the terrain softens into gentle hills and vineyard-dotted slopes. This medieval town is a hidden gem, tucked into the Bierzo wine region of Galicia, with cobbled streets, old stone churches, and the scent of wood smoke in the air.

It's a peaceful, authentic spot to rest for the night — and maybe sip a local Mencía red before bed.

VILAFRANCA DEL BIERZO TO SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA

DAY 5

Start Location: Villafranca del Bierzo

End Location: Santiago de Compostela

Distance: Approx. 150 Miles

Highlights:

- Scenic ride through Galicia's lush countryside
- Ride along the historic Camino de Santiago
- Explore Santiago's cathedrals and cobbled streets
- Soak up the pilgrim vibe with local wine & octopus



We ride out from Villafranca del Bierzo and ease into the day with gentle, rolling landscapes and rural lanes that lead us deeper into Galicia. Expect twisting mountain backroads, the scent of eucalyptus, and lush countryside all around.

As we close in on Santiago, the road becomes part of something bigger — we trace sections of the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage, riding through spiritual heartlands and past weathered stone markers.

Arriving into Santiago de Compostela, the ancient capital of Galicia, is a moment to savour. Towering cathedrals, cobbled streets, and the hum of pilgrims create an atmosphere unlike anywhere else.

We land here in time for a well-earned rest day tomorrow — so tonight, it's all about soaking up the energy of the old town, maybe with some fresh-caught octopus and a Galician wine in hand.

SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA (REST DAY)

DAY 6

Start & End Location: Santiago de Compostela

Day Trip Ideas:

If you're up for exploring, Santiago has plenty to offer beyond the cathedral. Visit the Museo do Pobo Galego for a deep dive into Galician culture, or wander the beautifully kept Alameda Park for views over the old town. The Mercado de Abastos is great for sampling local flavours, and if you're feeling spiritual (or curious), step inside the cathedral's Portico of Glory or catch the famous Botafumeiro ceremony if it's on.

Today's all yours to explore, recover, and reset.

Santiago isn't just a city — it's an experience. A maze of ancient streets, historic facades, and the echo of thousands of journeys ending at the magnificent cathedral. You'll see tired pilgrims, bustling tapas bars, and that unique northern Spanish blend of humility and celebration.

Some riders might fancy a walk to the Praza do Obradoiro, others a lazy breakfast and a slow wander through town. Feel free to do as much or as little as you like — grab a souvenir, find a local café, or just kick back and soak in the culture.

Tonight, we regroup over a good meal, share a few stories, and look ahead to the ride through the Spanish heartlands tomorrow.



SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA TO LEÓN

DAY 7

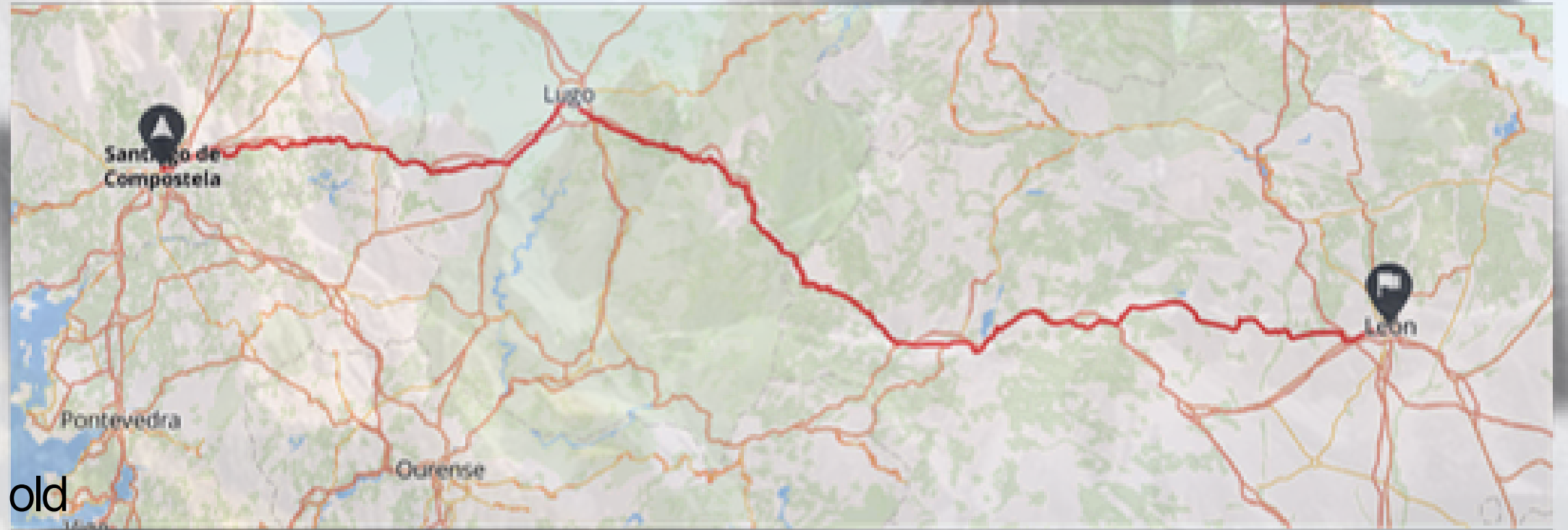
Start Location: Santiago de Compostela

End Location: León

Distance: Approx: 180 Miles

Highlights:

- Classic riding through farmland and open roads
- Peaceful villages and historic towns en route
- Explore León's Gothic cathedral and buzzing old quarter
- Pintxos and beer in the Plaza Mayor to end the day



We fire up the bikes and leave Santiago behind, heading inland for a big day across the backbone of northern Spain.

The route today is a mix of rolling farmland, wooded stretches, and sweeping open roads, as we make our way toward the ancient city of León. Along the way, you'll ride through forgotten hamlets and pass historic towns that have stood for centuries.

This is classic riding country — big skies, light traffic, and long, satisfying bends.

Arriving in León, the vibe shifts again. It's a city rich in medieval and Roman history, but with a modern buzz. The Cathedral of León is one of Spain's finest Gothic structures, and the old quarter is a joy to explore on foot.

Dinner tonight? Pintxos and a beer in the Plaza Mayor is the local way.

LEÓN TO ARGOMANIZ

DAY 8

Start Location: León

End Location: Argomaniz

Distance: Approx: 220 Miles

Highlights:

- Epic riding through wild Castile and León
- Sweeping bends, mountain passes & remote ridgelines
- Rustic charm of Espinosa de los Monteros
- Proper off-the-radar biker heaven



We roll out of León and quickly leave the city buzz behind, trading it for big horizons and the quiet rhythm of rural Spain. Today's ride takes us through the wild heart of Castile and León, where the landscape is untamed and the roads often feel like they were built just for motorbikes.

Expect a mix of smooth sweepers and tight mountain sections as we head toward the foothills of the Basque Country, carving through remote valleys, hidden passes, and long-forgotten ridgelines.

By late afternoon, we descend into Argomaniz — a serene hilltop village overlooking the sweeping plains below. It's known for its historic charm, traditional stone architecture, and calm atmosphere, with stunning views across the Álava region.

This is a rider's kind of place — peaceful, scenic, and surrounded by brilliant biking territory.

ARGOMANIZ TO LARRAU

DAY 9

Start Location: Argomaniz

End Location: Larrau (Pyrenees)

Distance: Approx. 240 Miles

Highlights:

- Epic all-day ride through northern Spain's hidden mountain routes
- Craggy gorges, alpine curves & wild remote scenery
- Arrival in the cinematic mountain hamlet of Larrau
- Stars, silence, and real Pyrenean mountain air



We carve east across northern Spain, riding through a series of lesser-known mountain passes and plateaus, gradually climbing toward the mighty Pyrenees. The ride is long, but it's nothing short of spectacular — a constantly changing mix of alpine curves, craggy gorges, and tiny farming villages.

By the time we reach the remote mountain hamlet of Larrau, we've crossed into an entirely different vibe. The Pyrenees rise up in every direction, wild and cinematic, with roads that twist like ribbon and barely a car in sight.

This evening, we bed down in real mountain country — the kind of place where stars come out in force, the air is fresh, and silence speaks loud.

LARRAU & PYRENEES PASSES LOOP RIDE

DAY 10

Start & End Location: Larrau

Distance: 90–150 miles depending on route

Ride Options:

There's no single route today — just a handful of spectacular ones. We'll chat over a beer the night before to decide which loop suits the group best. Whether you're in the mood for a laid-back scenic cruise or a full-on mountain attack, there's an option that'll blow your mind. Every turn offers something special out here.

No packing today — just pure, unfiltered riding.

We stay based in Larrau and head out for a loop ride through some of the most thrilling mountain roads in the Pyrenees. Expect tight hairpins, dramatic ridge climbs, sweeping descents, and panoramic views that make you want to pull over every five minutes.

This is a rider's paradise — quiet roads that cling to the mountainside, tiny border towns, and rugged, high-altitude scenery that keeps delivering all day long.

Depending on weather and group energy, we can choose between a shorter loop to soak it in at a slower pace — or crank out a full-blown day that'll leave your tyres warm and your memory card full.

Return to Larrau late afternoon to unwind with a cold beer, a hot meal, and the feeling of having earned it.



LARRAU TO SAN SEBASTIÁN

DAY 11

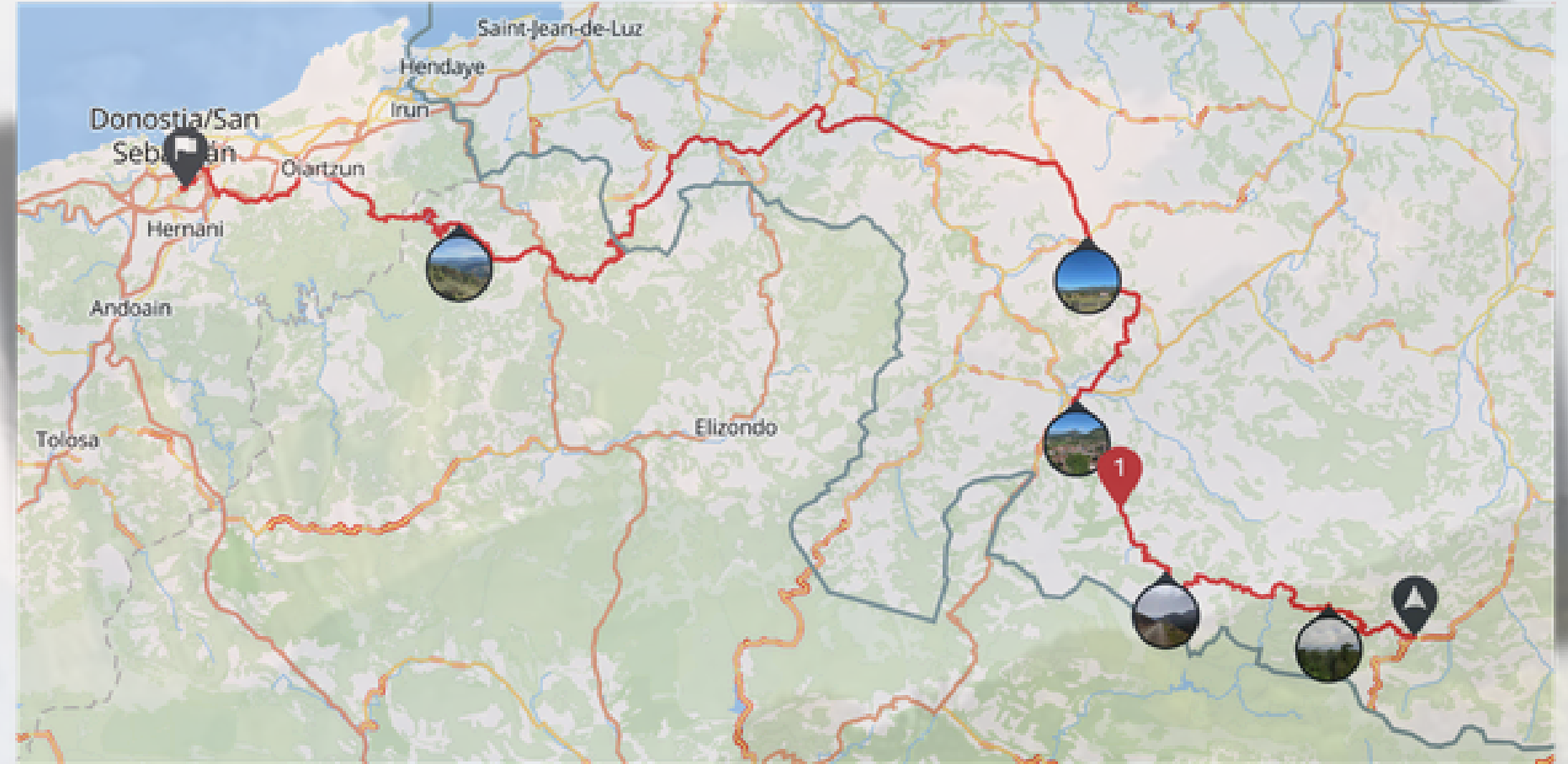
Start Location: Larrau

End Location: San Sebastián

Distance: Approx. 100 Miles

Highlights:

- Descend from Pyrenean peaks to the Basque coast
- Twisting roads, lush valleys & borderland views
- Cruise into chic, beachside San Sebastián
- Pintxos, surf, sunshine & serious good vibes



After two nights in the mountains, we drop down out of the Pyrenees and head for the coast — and what a finish it is.

Today may be shorter in distance, but it's one of the most satisfying rides of the tour. We descend through twisting forest roads, lush Basque valleys, and remote borderlands, gradually transitioning from alpine to ocean air.

Rolling into San Sebastián is like switching worlds — white sands, surfboards, Belle Époque buildings, and tapas bars as far as the eye can see. It's stylish, relaxed, and buzzing with life.

Once checked in, the rest of the day is yours. Whether it's sunning yourself by the beach, strolling the old town, or diving into a pintxos crawl, San Sebastián knows how to show riders a good time.

SAN SEBASTIÁN TO BILBAO

DAY 12

Start Location: San Sebastián

End Location: Bilbao

Distance: Approx. 150 Miles

Highlights:

- Ride coastal twisties and lush Basque backroads
- Dramatic sea views, wooded climbs & flowy tarmac
- Big city finish in buzzing Bilbao
- Tapas, txakoli, and a toast to an epic ride



We ride out of San Sebastián late morning, hugging the rugged Basque coastline before looping inland through a series of epic twisties and green hills.

Today's route gives us a little of everything — dramatic sea views, rural lanes, wooded climbs, and fast-flowing sections that keep you smiling in your helmet.

By the time we reach Bilbao, you'll feel like you've properly ridden the Basque Country. The city itself is a mix of industrial grit and avant-garde culture, anchored by the striking Guggenheim Museum and buzzing riverside districts.

Tonight we toast the final few days of the journey — with big city energy, a great meal, and maybe even a glass of local txakoli wine.

BILBAO TO PUENTE VIESGO

DAY 13

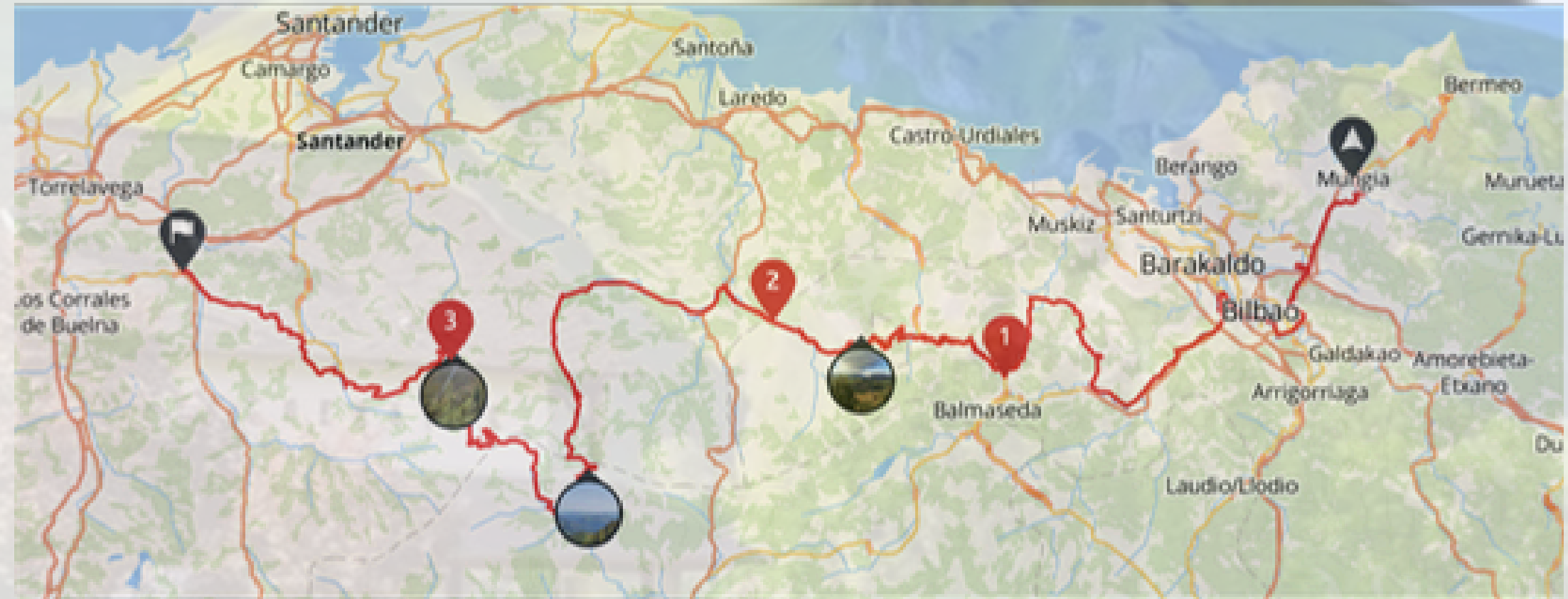
Start Location: Bilbao

End Location: Puente Viesgo

Distance: Approx: 120 Miles

Highlights:

- Final blast through the Cantabrian hills
- Coastal curves, tight backroads & low traffic
- Spa town charm in laid-back Puente Viesgo
- Last dinner together before the journey home



Our final full riding day brings us back toward Santander — but not without squeezing in one more cracking stretch of road. We escape the city sprawl of Bilbao early and cut a route through the green Cantabrian hills, riding a mixture of coastal sweeps and tight backroads, with far less traffic than you'd expect this close to the coast.

By the afternoon, we arrive in Puente Viesgo, a picturesque spa town nestled in the hills, known for its thermal waters, peaceful riverside walks, and laid-back atmosphere. It's the perfect final destination — close to Santander for the ferry tomorrow, but still full of northern Spanish charm.

One last dinner together, some laughs, and a good night's sleep before we roll onto the ferry home.

PUENTE VIESGO TO FERRY — RETURN TO UK

DAY 14

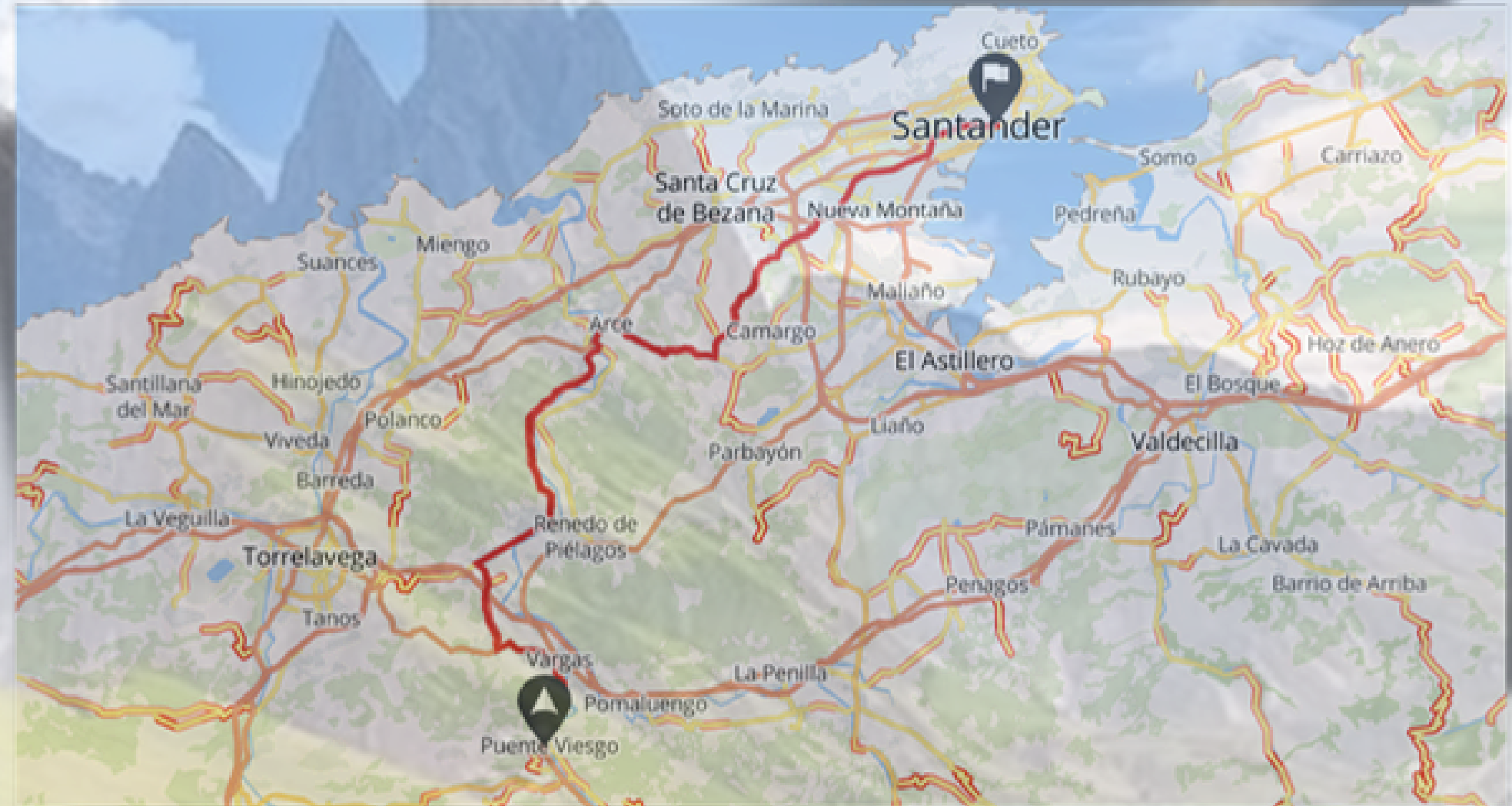
Start Location: Puente Viesgo

End Location: Santander → Plymouth

Distance: Approx. 30 Miles

Ferry Departure: 6:00pm

Arrival in UK: 4:00pm [day 15]



We enjoy a slow start today — no rush, no rush-hour — just a short final ride through the morning light back to Santander ferry port.

The last few kilometres give you a chance to soak it all in: the mountain passes, the coast, the friendships made, and the sense of distance travelled.

Once onboard, we settle into our private cabins, maybe grab a drink on deck, and watch the Spanish coast drift away. The ride may be done, but the memories (and photos) will be buzzing long after you're back on UK roads.

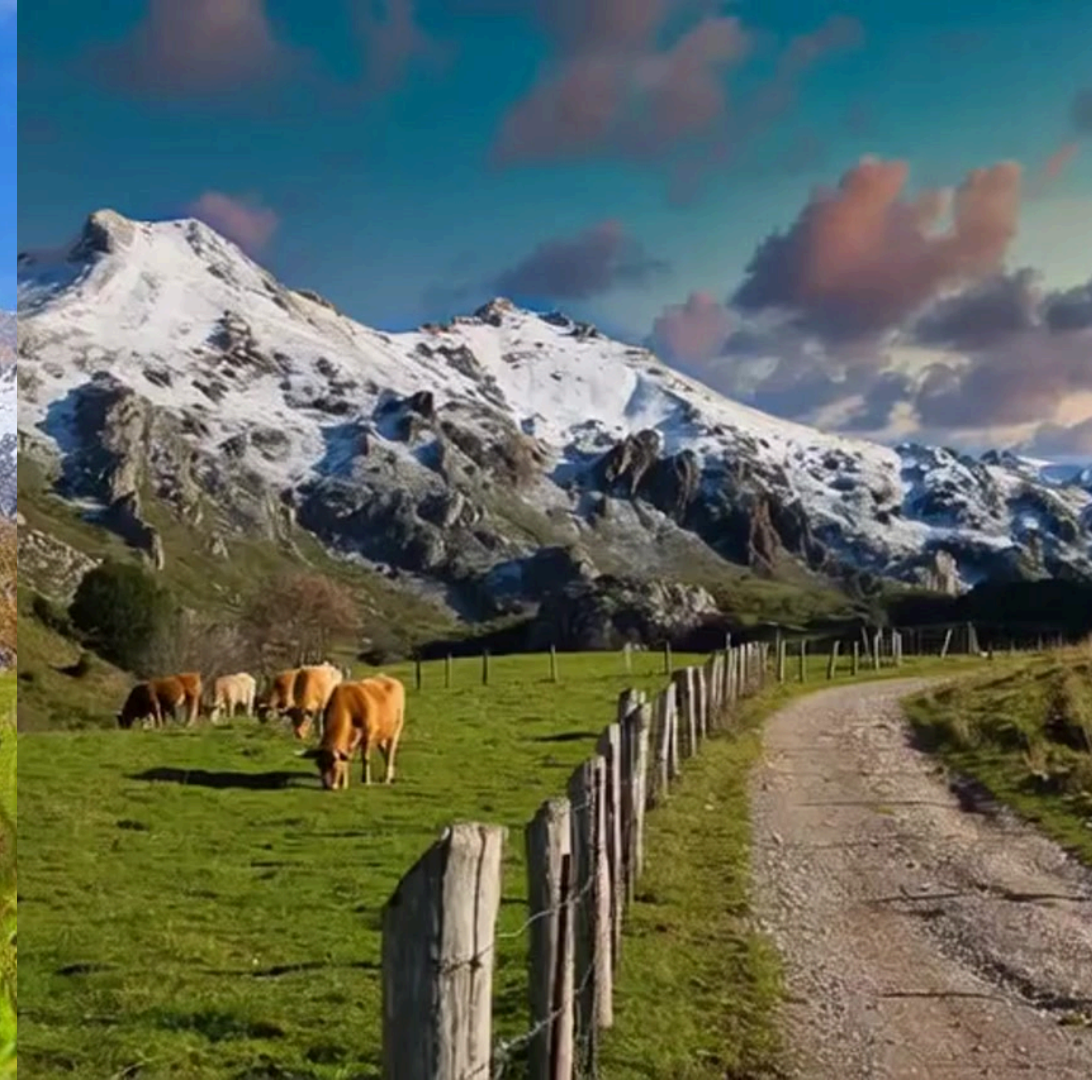

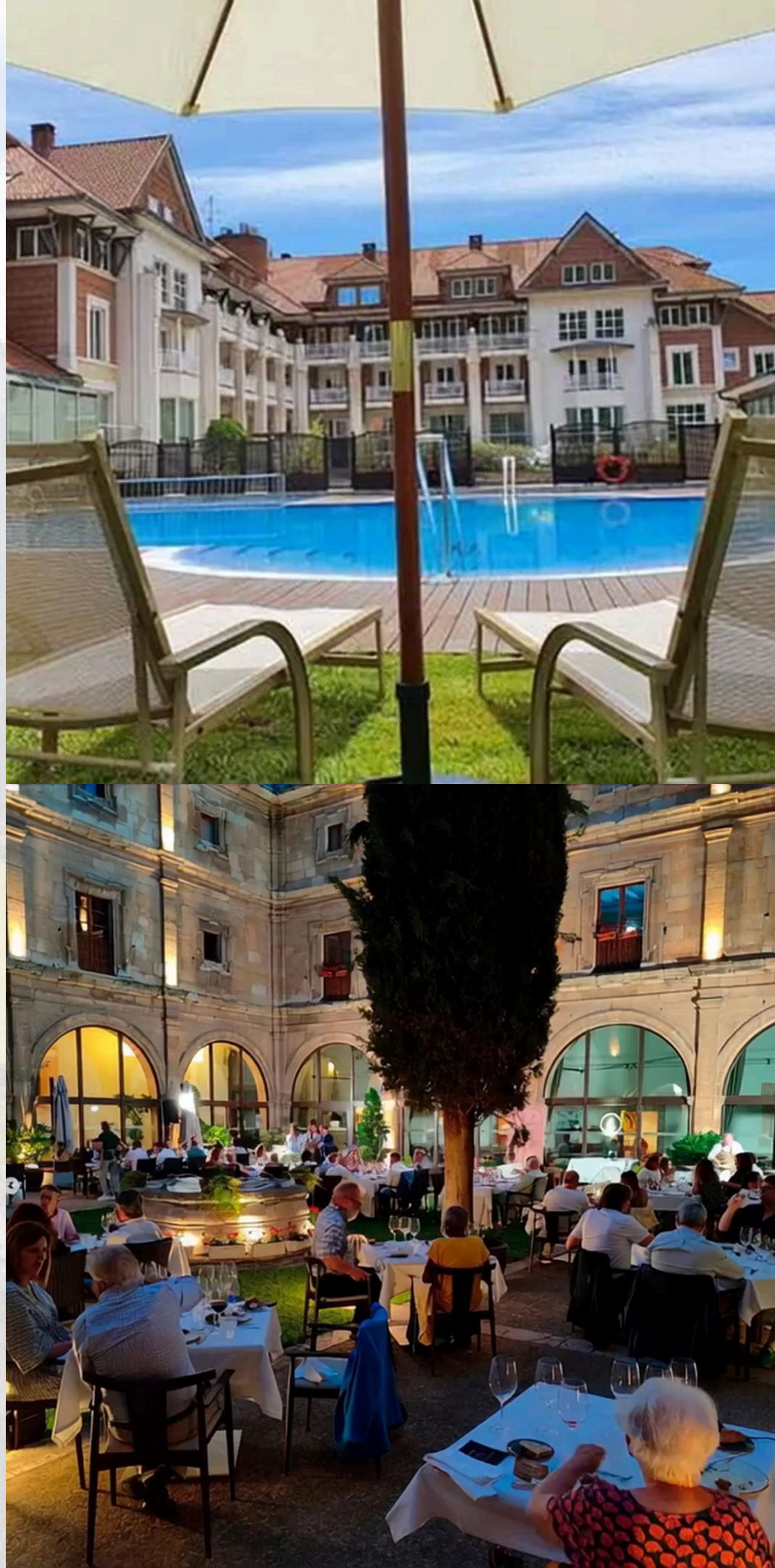

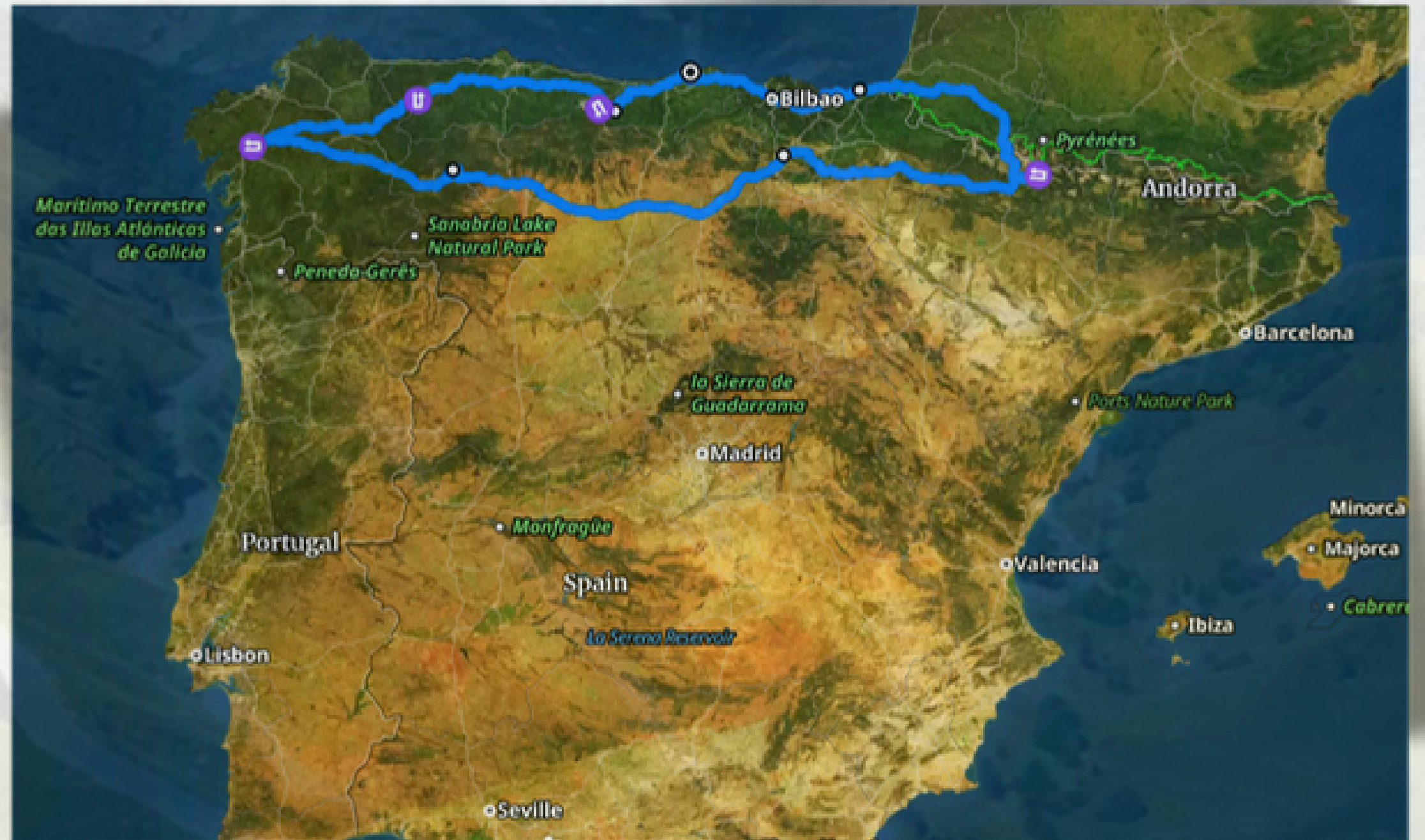
