Welcome to Wild Roads — where the ride is the destination.



We kick things off in northern France and cross into **Belgium's wild Ardennes** before hitting the twisties of Germany's **Black Forest**. From there, we carve through the **Dolomites** and cruise into the rolling hills of **Tuscany**.

After exploring **Florence, Montepulciano, and Lucca**, we push north into the **Western Alps** and loop back through **Burgundy** and **Champagne** on perfect backroads.

A bold mix of **mountains, culture, and curves** — made for riders who want more than just another tour.

FOLKESTONE TO ARDENNES REGION

DAY 1

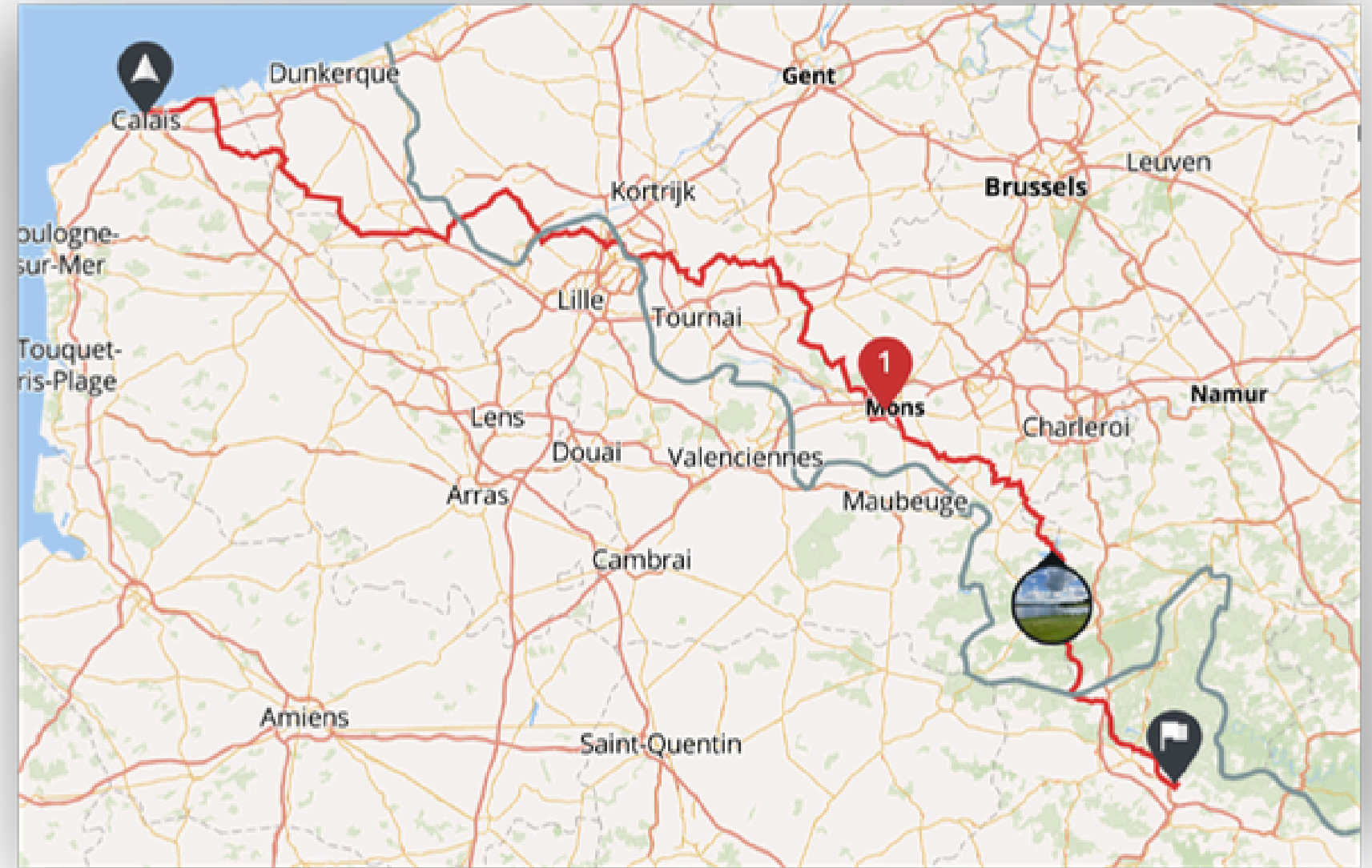
Start Location: Folkestone

End Location: Ardennes, Belgium

Distance: Approx. **200 Miles**

Highlights:

- Channel Tunnel crossing
- Cruise through northern France
- Rolling countryside & forested roads
- Warm-up ride into the Ardennes region



After a smooth and hassle-free tunnel crossing, we roll off the train tracks and onto the wide, open roads of northern France. The pace is relaxed, perfect for getting into the groove of continental riding. We cruise through sleepy villages, sunflower fields, and gentle farmland — a landscape that feels timeless, peaceful, and a world away from the bustle of home.

As we near the Belgian border, the scenery begins to shift. Flat plains give way to winding country lanes, undulating hills, and the rich, green embrace of the Ardennes forest. The air smells of pine and damp earth, and the road begins to twist just enough to wake up the senses.

By the afternoon, we're deep in the woods, where moss-covered trees flank the route and sunlight filters through the canopy in golden beams. It's here we find our first overnight stop — a quiet, family-run lodge hidden amongst the trees. There's a log fire waiting, maybe a cold beer or two on the terrace, and the gentle hush of the forest all around. It's the perfect setting to kick off the journey properly — no rush, no schedule, just the first taste of the ride to come.

ARDENNES REGION TO BLACK FOREST

DAY 2

Today's ride is a true continental sweep — three countries, one day, and a whole lot of curves in between. We start by weaving out of the tranquil Ardennes, the morning mist still lingering in the treetops as we ride through shaded lanes and quiet hamlets. The border into Luxembourg comes and goes in a blink, but the roads here are pure joy — smooth, sweeping, and almost suspiciously well-maintained. It's a compact country, but it packs in dramatic ridgelines, river valleys, and postcard-perfect villages that look like something out of a fairy tale.

From there, we press east into Germany and dive headlong into the Schwarzwald — the Black Forest. The name suits it. Dense, dark pine trees line the route, closing in around rollercoaster roads that dip and rise through the hills. Timber-framed houses peek out from forest clearings, and roadside cafes offer the perfect excuse to stop and soak it all in. Every corner tempts you to lean in just a little harder.

By the time we reach our lodge for the night, tucked deep among the trees, the bikes are warm and the beer is cold. There's the scent of woodsmoke in the air, the sound of clinking steins on the terrace, and plates stacked with schnitzel, spätzle, and all the good stuff. It's been a proper day on the road — the kind that sticks with you.

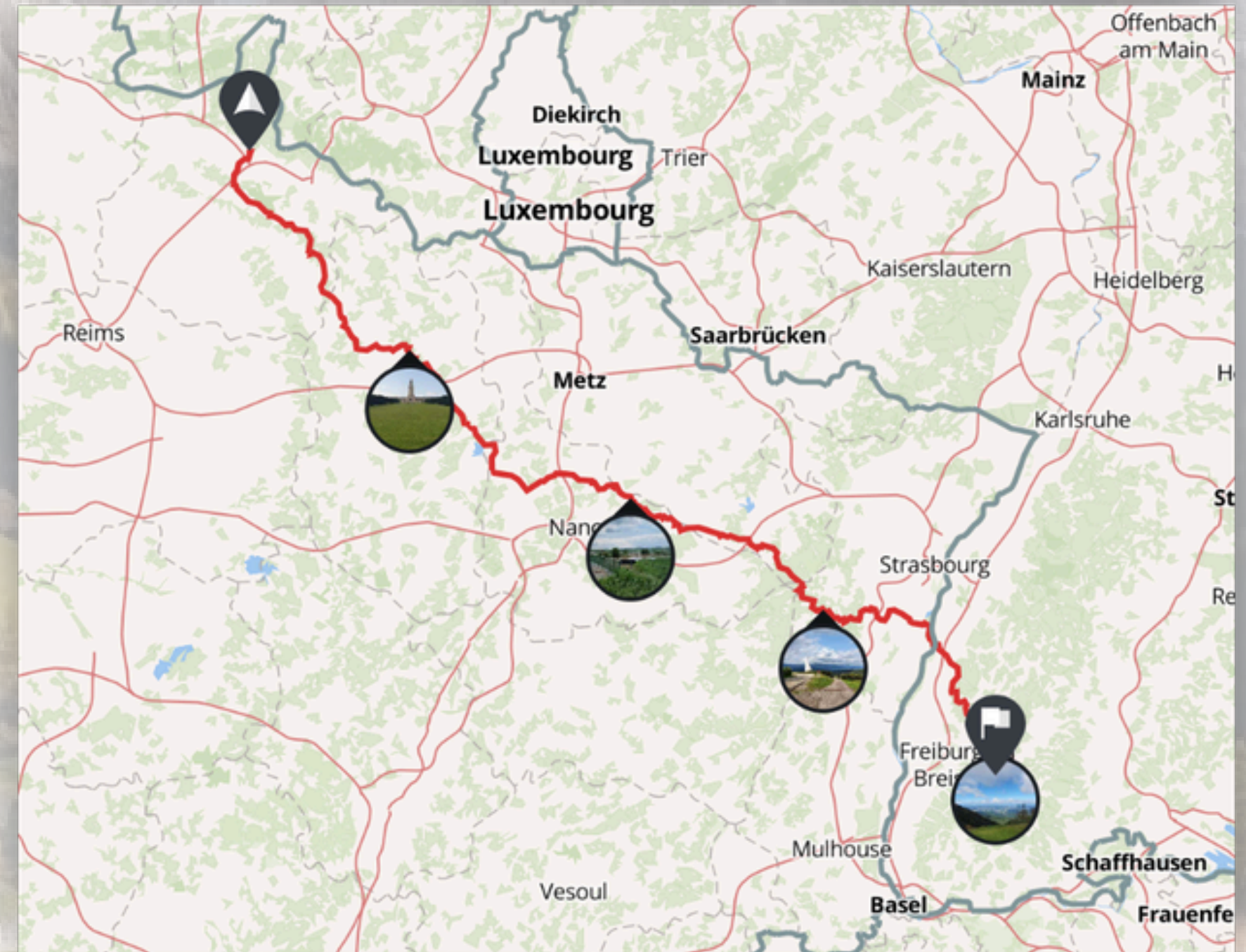

BLACK FOREST TO GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN

DAY 3

Start Location: Black Forest

End Location: Day Loop

Distance: Approx. **190 Miles**

Highlights:

- Scenic ride along the edge of the Alps
- Rolling Bavarian countryside & winding valley roads
- Historic towns & timber-framed villages
- Beer halls, mountains & alpine charm



We break camp in the heart of the Black Forest and head southeast, riding out of the dark pine corridors and into open landscapes that gradually rise and roll with the rhythm of the approaching Alps. This is a day to stretch the throttle and settle into the flow — sweeping roads, gentle elevation changes, and wide valleys with rivers threading through green meadows.

The Bavarian countryside is storybook stuff: red-roofed villages, onion-domed churches, and rustic roadside inns. As we ride, the mountains loom ever larger on the horizon — teasing what's to come. Stops along the way might include a lakeside bratwurst, a quiet forest chapel, or a coffee in a sleepy village square where time seems to move a little slower.

By late afternoon, we roll into Garmisch-Partenkirchen — a jewel of southern Germany and a gateway to the Alps. Surrounded by towering peaks and dripping with alpine character, it's a perfect blend of nature and culture. Expect classic beer halls, hearty Bavarian food, cobbled streets, and mountain views from every corner. Tonight, we soak it all in — cold steins, warm lights, and a soft bed under the shadow of the Zugspitze.

GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN TO BOLZANO (SOUTH TYROL)

DAY 4

Start Location: Black Forest

End Location: Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Bavaria

Distance: Approx. **190 Miles**

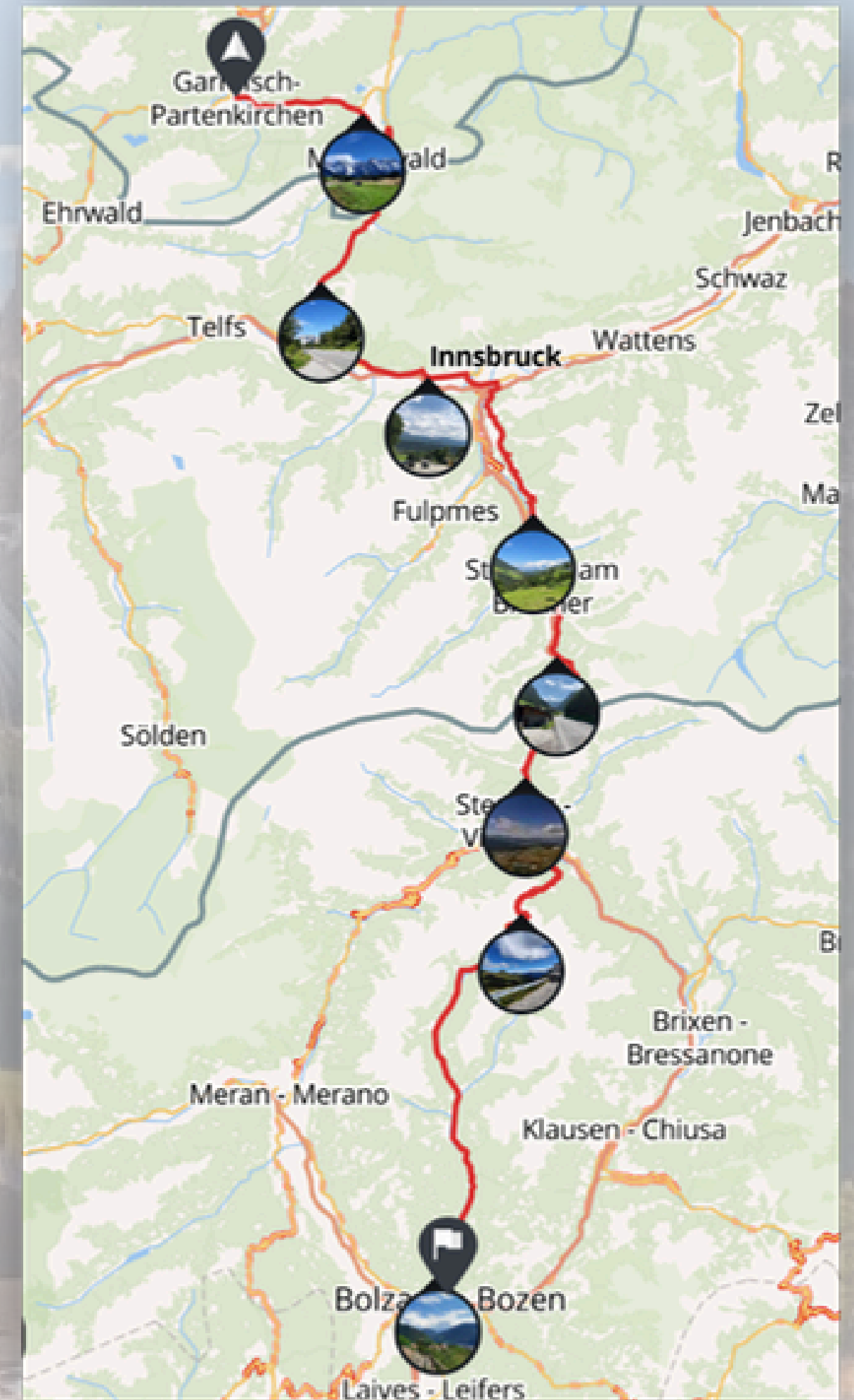
Highlights:

Ride through Germany, Austria, and into Italy
Scenic climbs and dramatic alpine views
Cross alpine passes with sweeping switchbacks
Arrive in Bolzano — gateway to the Dolomites

We leave Garmisch with the crisp mountain air still clinging to our jackets and head straight into alpine territory. This is a ride of transitions — not just through landscapes, but through cultures. Germany fades into Austria with barely a sign, and before long, the roads begin to climb and twist through high alpine passes, where every corner reveals a new view worth slowing down for.

The scenery becomes more dramatic with each passing hour — jagged peaks, icy streams, cowbells echoing through the valleys. We cross into Italy and descend into South Tyrol, where the blend of Austrian efficiency and Italian flair is on full display. The roads are a dream — engineered perfection with views that feel like a movie backdrop.

We roll into Bolzano by late afternoon — a town that sits at the cultural crossroads of north and south. Italian espresso bars sit next to German beer halls, and the streets hum with a laid-back, mountain-town buzz. Tonight, it's all about that first taste of the Dolomites — pizza, prosecco, and a sense that the real high-altitude magic is just getting started.



DOLOMITE DAY LOOP RIDE (PASS BLITZ!)

DAY 5

This is what we came for — the pure, unfiltered thrill of riding the Dolomites. With panniers off and spirits high, we dive into a day carved entirely for bikers. The Sella Ronda is the crown jewel of this region, a loop of towering limestone peaks and tight, twisting passes that challenge and reward in equal measure.

We climb high over the passes — Pordoi, Gardena, Sella, Giau — names whispered with reverence in the biker world. The roads are a ballet of hairpins, switchbacks, and flowing sweepers. Tiny alpine huts serve espresso with views that make your jaw drop, and each summit gives way to another perfectly paved descent.

It's a choose-your-own-adventure kind of day — stop when you want, ride as hard or as easy as you like. The only schedule is the one you set. Want to pause for a mountain lunch? Find a sunny patio and do it. Want to ride till the sun starts to dip? Go for it — the roads will be waiting.

By day's end, we roll back into Bolzano, adrenaline still humming in the veins and stories already forming. You'll sleep well tonight — unless you're lying awake replaying those bends in your mind.

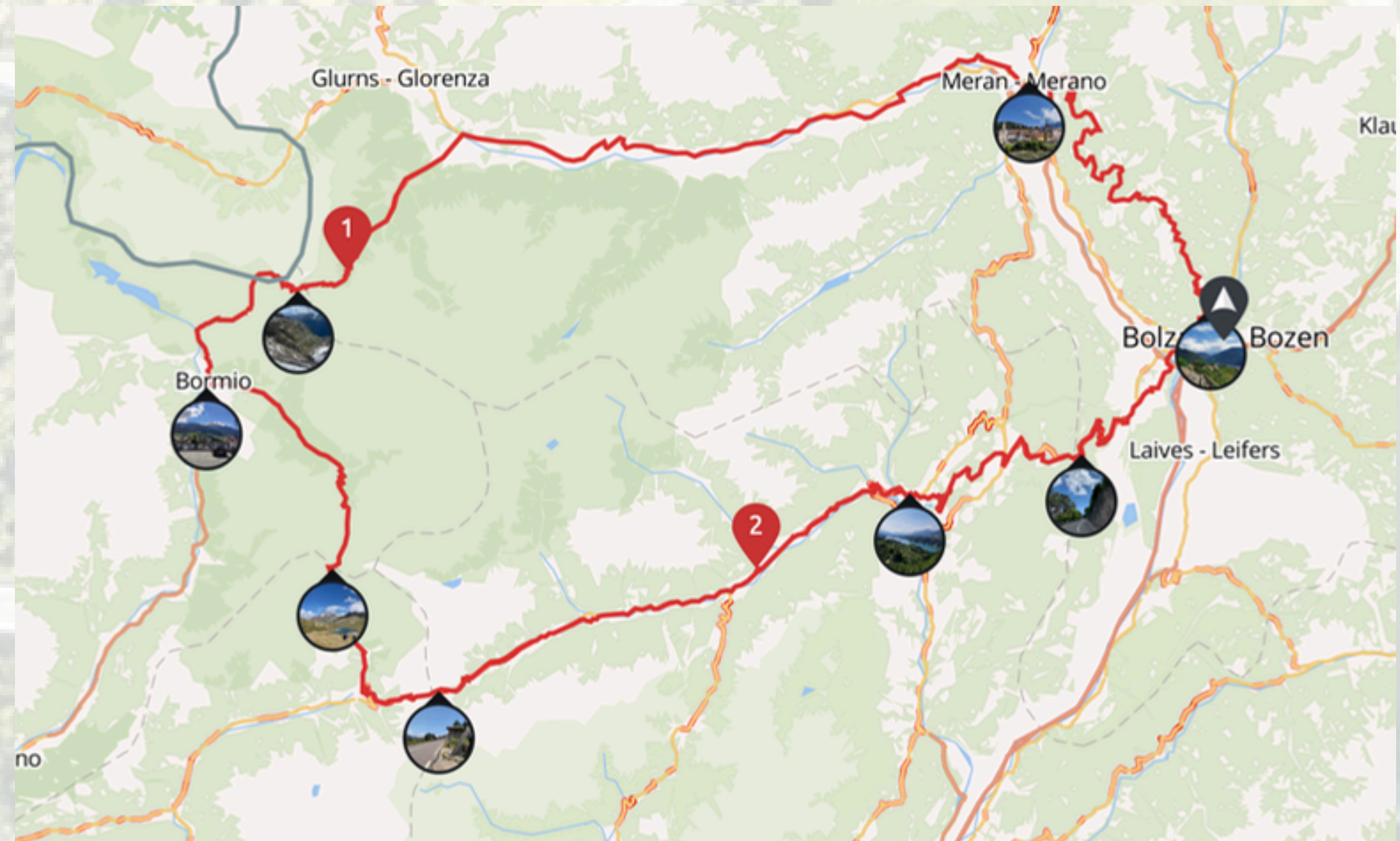

DAY 6

BOLZANO TO BOLOGNA

Start Location: Bolzano, Italy

End Location: Bologna

Distance: Approx: 190 Miles

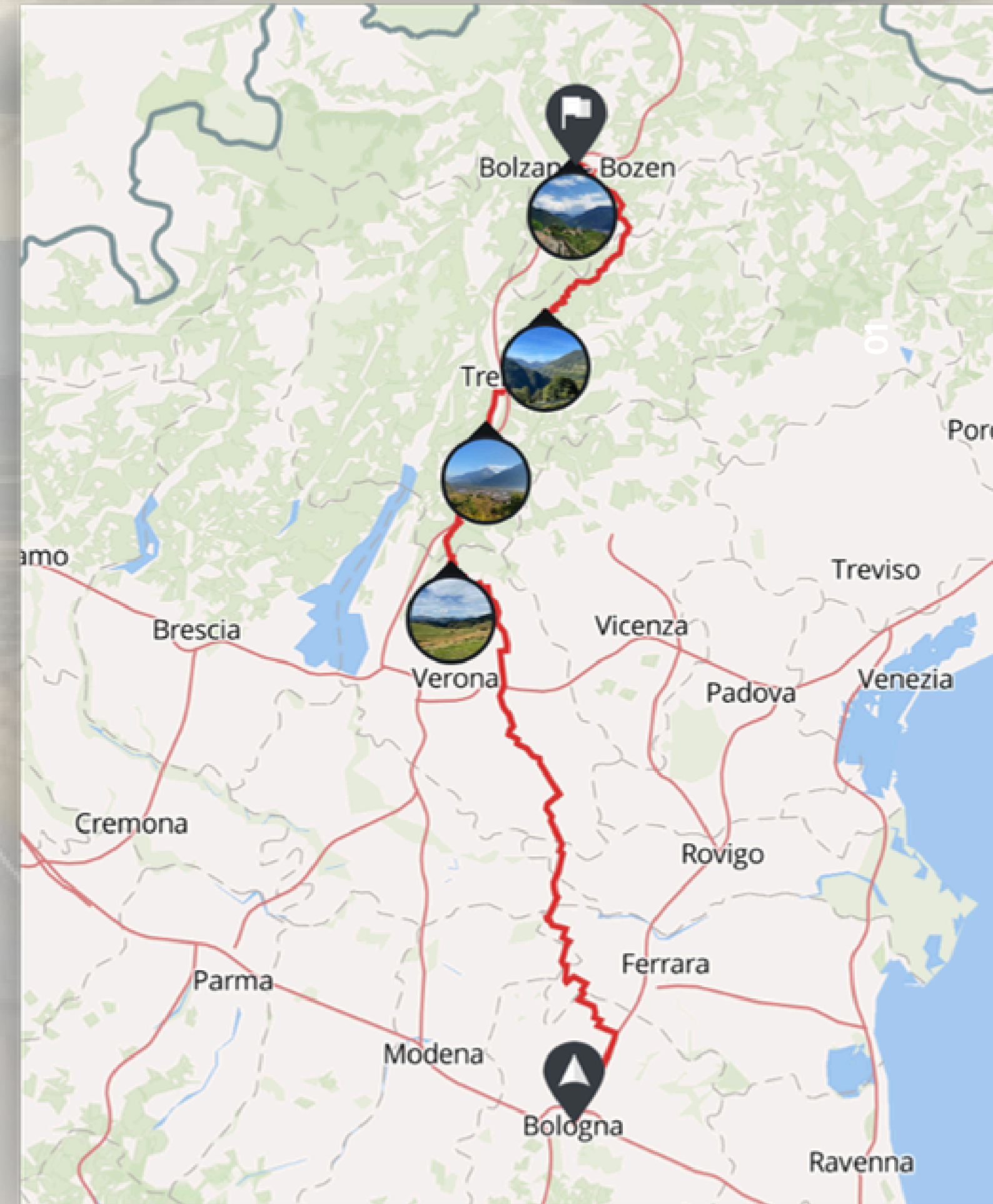
Highlights:

- Descend from the Dolomites into the Italian plains
- Ride through Trentino's apple orchards and vineyards
- Scenic sweepers and motorway freedom
- Arrive in Bologna — Italy's food capital

After two days in the heights of the Dolomites, today we drop into a different rhythm — descending from the alpine passes into the rolling plains of northern Italy. The ride begins with mountain views in the mirror, as we cruise past vineyards, orchards, and castle-topped hills. The roads ease off, trading tight bends for long sweepers and open stretches perfect for relaxing into the ride.

We gradually slide into a warmer, flatter, more Mediterranean landscape — with olive trees replacing pine forests and the scent of the mountains giving way to sun-baked fields and warm wind. Depending on the route, we may cruise a mix of fast-moving autostrada and rural backroads, with occasional breaks for espresso and gelato.

By mid to late afternoon, we reach Bologna — the lively capital of the Emilia-Romagna region. It's a vibrant, historic city famous for its food, with arched porticos, cobbled alleys, and a golden-red glow to the buildings. Tonight, we trade alpine fare for tagliatelle al ragù, cured meats, and a glass of Lambrusco. Welcome to the belly of Italy.



BOLOGNA TO FLORENCE (HALF-DAY RIDE)

DAY 7

Start Location: Bologna

End Location: Florence

Distance: Approx. 80 miles

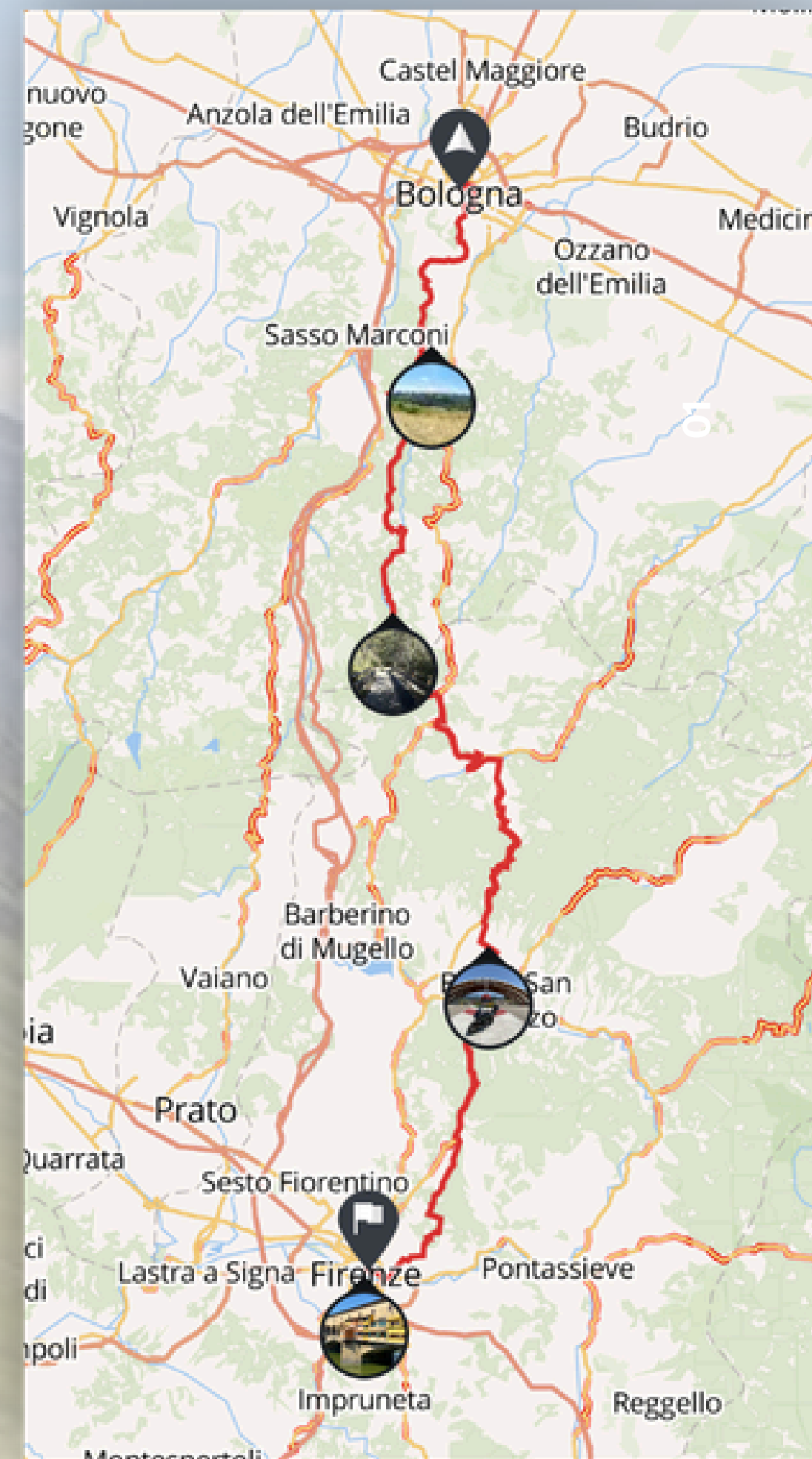
Highlights:

- Cross the Apennine Mountains
- Ride one of Italy's most scenic lesser-known passes
- Midday arrival into Florence
- Free afternoon for museums, markets & rooftop views

Today's a short but satisfying ride — just long enough to scratch the itch, but early enough to land us in Florence with half a day to explore. We exit Bologna and make our way into the Apennines, riding through forested hills and twisting country roads that connect Italy's north to its central soul.

There's something poetic about the route today — a quieter, less-touristed side of the country that reveals itself through tiny hillside villages, crumbling chapels, and locals selling fruit by the roadside. The roads are smooth, the traffic light, and the corners just tight enough to keep things fun.

By lunchtime, we roll into Florence — the cradle of the Renaissance. The bikes cool in a secure car park while we swap helmets for sunglasses and go full tourist (or flâneur, if you prefer). Whether you fancy an afternoon in the Uffizi, a walk across the Ponte Vecchio, or just sitting in a piazza with a spritz in hand — this is your time. Dinner tonight? The kind you'll talk about for years.



FLORENCE TO MONTEPULCIANO (VIA AREZZO)

DAY 8

Start Location: Florence

End Location: Montepulciano

Distance: 80 Miles

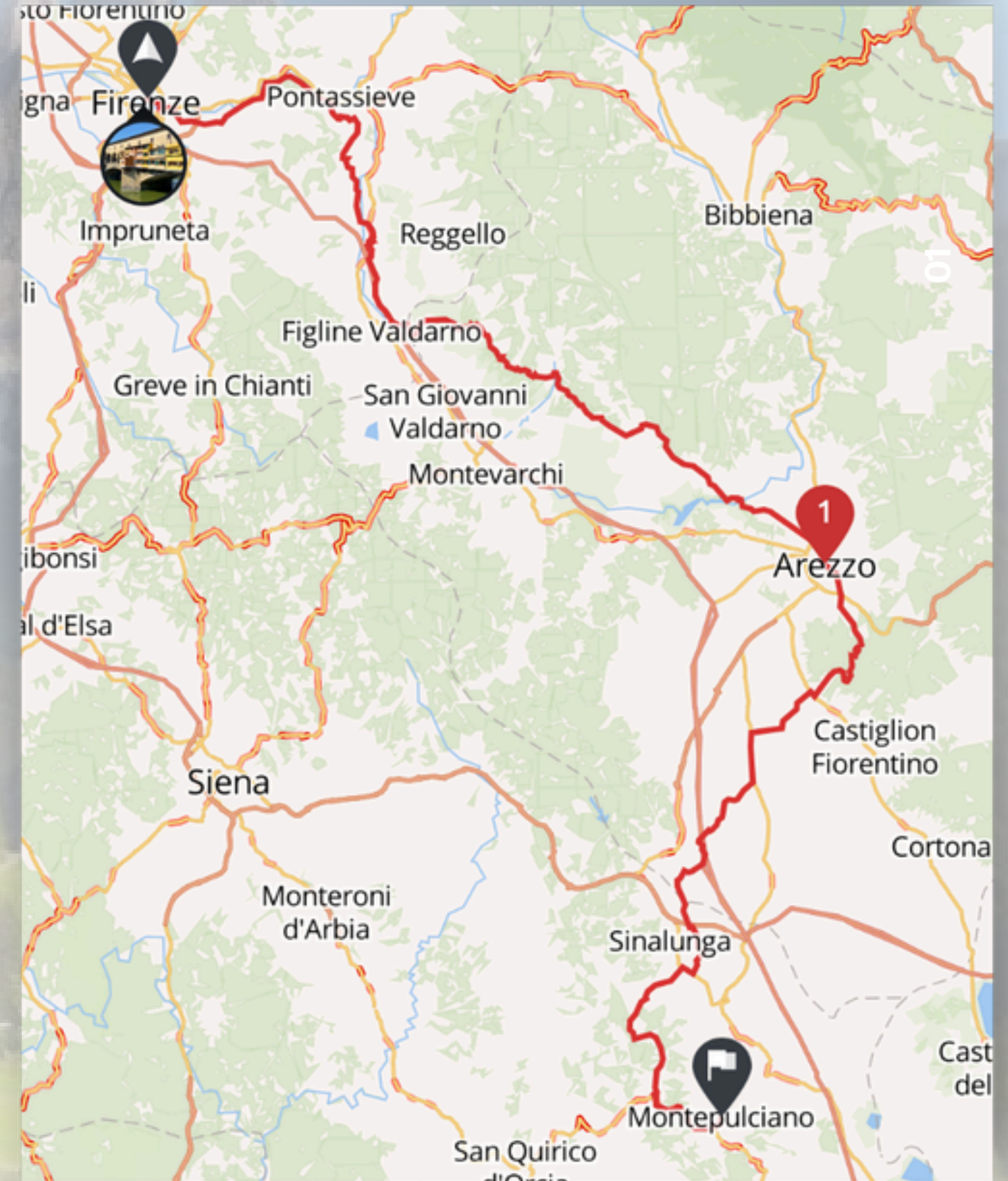
Highlights:

- Ride through classic Tuscan countryside
- Stop in historic Arezzo — a hidden Renaissance gem
- Olive groves, hilltop towns, and vineyard views
- Arrive in Montepulciano for a golden-hour wine welcome

We leave Florence behind, but the magic of Tuscany stays with us all day. Our route today is all about backroads — the kind that wind gently past stone farmhouses, sunflower fields, and cypress-lined driveways. This is the Tuscany of postcards, and we've got the perfect machine to ride through it.

Our first highlight is Arezzo, a lesser-known but stunning town filled with medieval charm and Renaissance beauty. A quick coffee in the piazza, a look at the frescoes, and we're off again — south through the Val di Chiana, where vineyards and olive groves paint the hillsides in warm, earthy tones.

By afternoon, we roll into Montepulciano, perched high above the surrounding countryside with its terracotta rooftops, ancient cellars, and knockout views. There's time to check in, clean up, and catch the sunset over the valley with a glass of *Vino Nobile di Montepulciano* in hand. This is the good life — and we're living it.



MONTEPULCIANO TO LUCCA

DAY 9

Today we carve a line from the quiet southern reaches of Tuscany to its lively northern edge — swapping vineyards and medieval towers for olive groves, forested hills, and wide, scenic valleys. The route is a feast for the senses: winding backroads, sleepy villages, and sweeping curves that seem tailor-made for two wheels.

We pass through hidden gems and hillside hamlets untouched by mass tourism, where life still moves to the rhythm of church bells and the scent of freshly baked bread. The landscape is constantly changing — from golden plains to green hills, from wide open views to tight, tree-lined climbs and descents.

By afternoon, the towers of Lucca come into view — a beautifully preserved city encircled by Renaissance-era walls. Inside, you'll find shady cobblestone alleys, lively squares, and a musical soul (Puccini was born here, after all). Tonight, we explore on foot — maybe a walk along the ramparts before dinner under the stars. Lucca has a way of making you slow down, breathe deeper, and fall in love with Italy all over again.

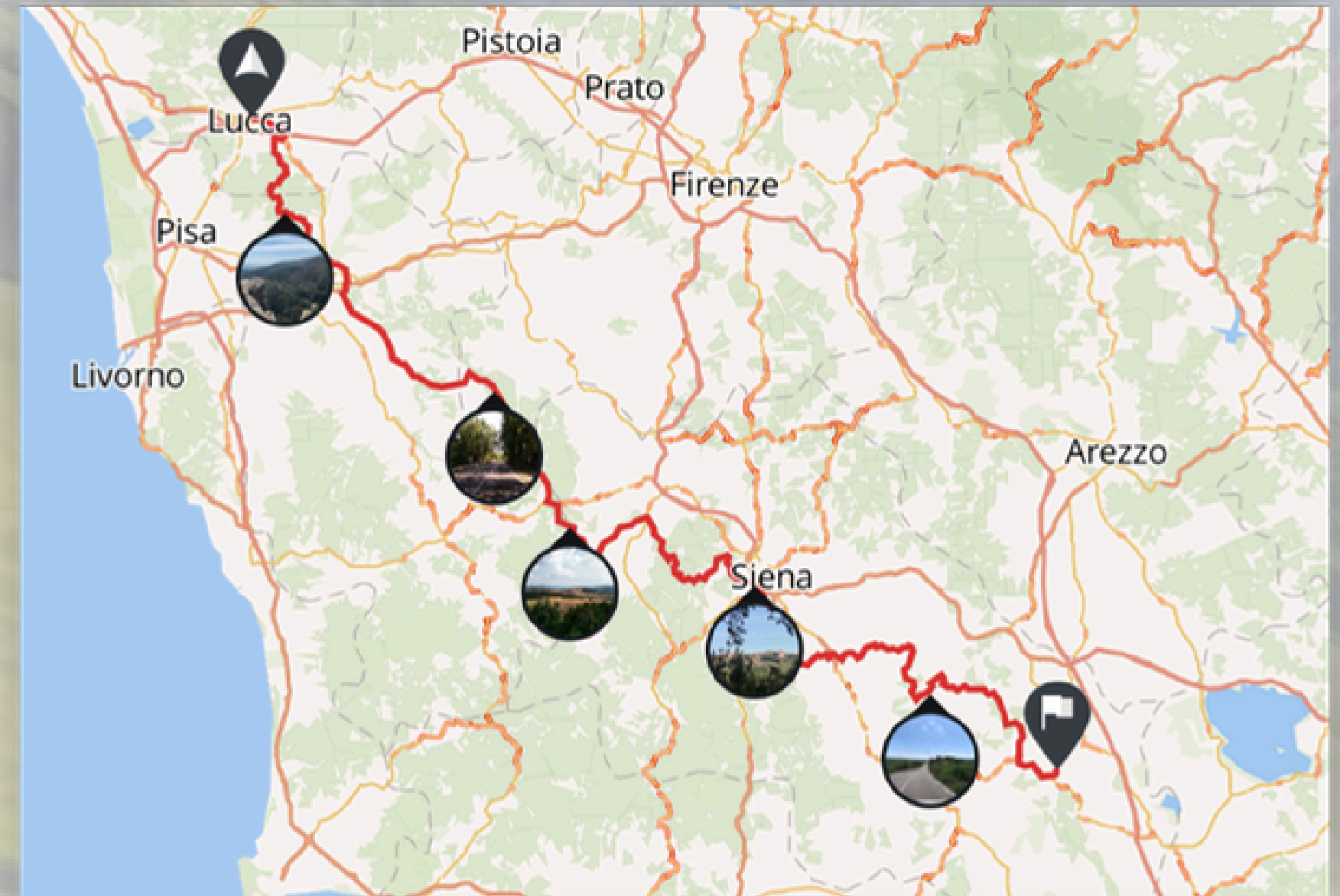

LUCCA [CHILLED CITY DAY]

DAY 10

Today's yours — a rest day in name, but it can be as active or laid-back as you like. Lucca invites you to slow down and soak it all in. Start your morning with a lazy cappuccino in Piazza San Michele, then maybe rent a bicycle and cruise the wide, tree-lined wall that encircles the old town — a unique feature unlike anywhere else in Italy.

Feel like stretching your legs further? You could take a short ride out toward the Apuan Alps, or even do a cheeky detour to see the Leaning Tower of Pisa (just don't try to straighten it). But for many, today's about letting the bike rest while you wander the maze of lanes, browse artisan shops, visit Puccini's birthplace, and enjoy a long Tuscan lunch.

In the evening, the streets come alive with the gentle hum of music, conversation, and clinking glasses. Whether it's pizza in the piazza, or local wines on a terrace, Lucca will charm you like nowhere else. This is a real 'ahh' moment in the tour.

LUCCA TO THE PIEDMONT FOOTHILLS

DAY 11

With our batteries recharged, we fire up the bikes and head out from Lucca, bidding farewell to Tuscany as we start the northern climb toward the Piedmont region. The day unfolds with a changing palette — rolling olive groves become wooded hills, which slowly give way to the open, vineyard-clad landscapes of Italy's famed wine country.

Our route winds through Liguria's quieter corners, with relaxed backroads and chances to stop in humble villages where the food is as authentic as it gets. This is a transitional ride — less about distance, more about enjoying the space between places. It's the kind of day where a slow lunch under a vine-covered pergola is as memorable as the road itself.

By evening, we arrive in the Piedmont foothills — where the Alps reappear in the distance like a promise of adventure still to come. Tonight's stop is peaceful and scenic — maybe a family-run agriturismo or countryside hotel, surrounded by vineyards and the soft hush of the hills. Tomorrow, we ride into the high Alps... but tonight, it's all about good wine, good food, and a sky full of stars.

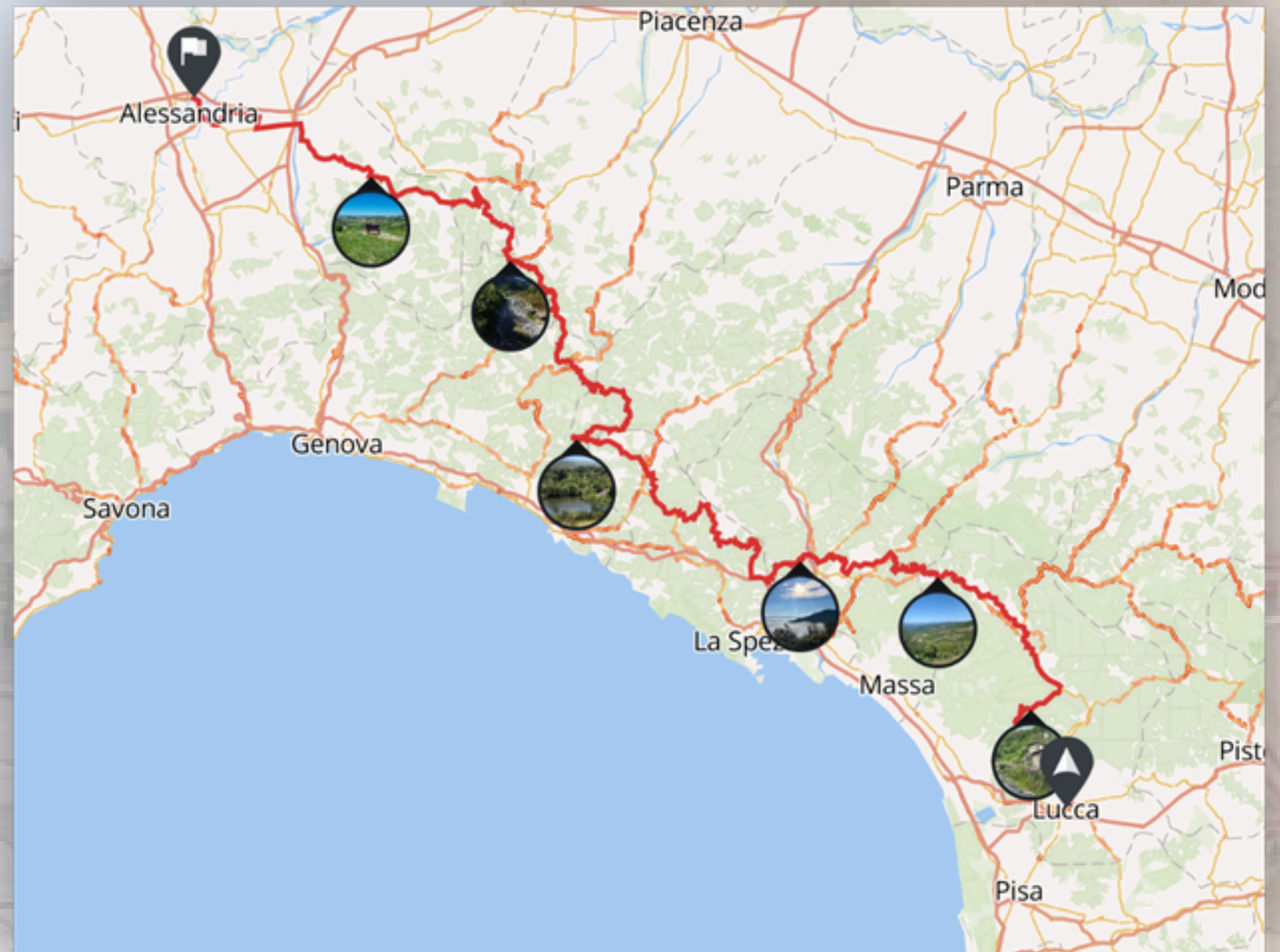

PIEDMONT FOOTHILLS TO COURMAYEUR

DAY 12

Start Location: Piedmont Foothills

End Location: Courmayeur

Distance: Approx. **140 Miles**

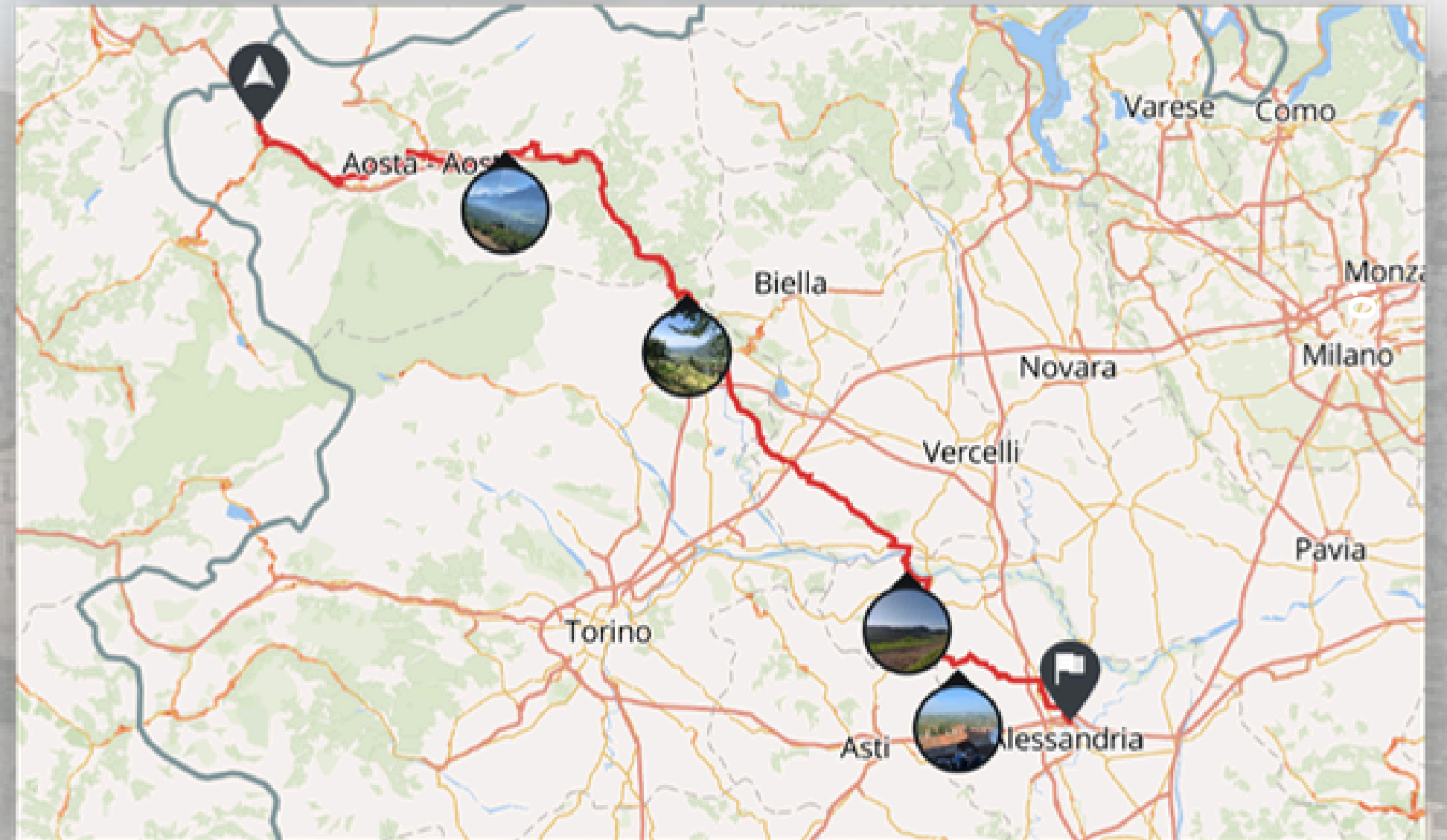
- Ride into the heart of the Western Alps
- Climb through Aosta Valley's dramatic scenery
- Optional alpine detours and panoramic passes
- Arrive in Courmayeur under the shadow of Mont Blanc

Today, the road tilts skyward. We leave the rolling vineyards of Piedmont behind and head toward the towering spine of the Alps. As we ride north, the terrain grows more dramatic — river valleys tighten into gorges, forests become darker and denser, and the mountains draw ever closer until they dominate the skyline.

We ride into the Aosta Valley, one of Italy's most scenic and historic regions, where medieval castles guard the hills and snow-capped peaks peer down from every angle. The roads are spectacular — wide sweepers through lush valleys, steep climbs, and the kind of twisties that keep you fully in the moment.

Depending on timing and group mood, we may add in a cheeky detour over one of the area's lesser-known passes — just enough to get the blood pumping before our descent into Courmayeur, nestled beneath the mighty Mont Blanc. This alpine town has a rugged-chic charm — think mountain lodges, stylish shops, hearty food, and views that make your jaw drop.

Tonight, it's time to kick back with a cold beer or a glass of red, surrounded by peaks and stories from the road.



COURMAYEUR TO DIJON

DAY 13

Start Location: Courmayeur

End Location: Dijon

Distance: Approx: **180 Miles**

Highlights:

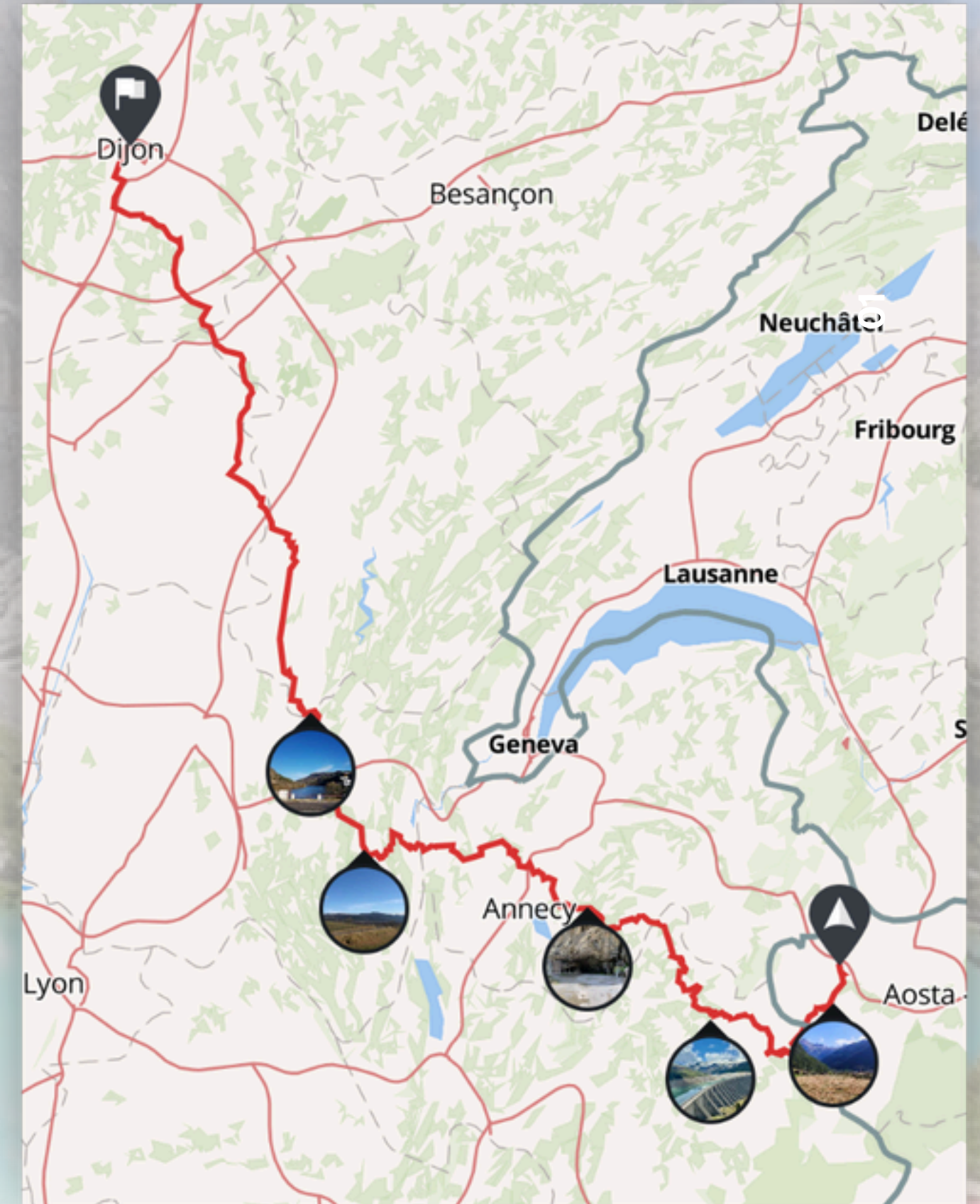
- Cross into France via alpine tunnels or mountain passes
- Ride from high-altitude drama to rolling countryside
- Enter the Burgundy region of France
- Dijon's historic streets, wine bars & relaxed charm

We wake in the shadows of the Alps and start the day with a ride that feels like a proper send-off. Whether it's through the Mont Blanc Tunnel or up and over one of the mountain passes (weather and time depending), the route out of Courmayeur is guaranteed to be stunning. This is a final taste of alpine glory — towering cliffs, icy streams, and roads that zigzag through natural amphitheatres of rock and sky.

As we cross into France, the landscape softens gradually. The jagged peaks give way to rolling green hills, and the fast-flowing mountain roads open out into wider, more relaxed country lanes. This transition from high drama to pastoral calm is one of the tour's quiet joys.

We arrive in Dijon, the capital of Burgundy — a region known for wine, mustard, and understated elegance. The old town is a mix of cobbled lanes, timbered houses, and golden-stone buildings. It's a great place to stroll, sip a local pinot noir, and toast another day's ride in proper French style.

The Alps are now in the rearview mirror... but the memory lingers.



DIJON TO REIMS

DAY 14

Start Location: Dijon

End Location: Reims

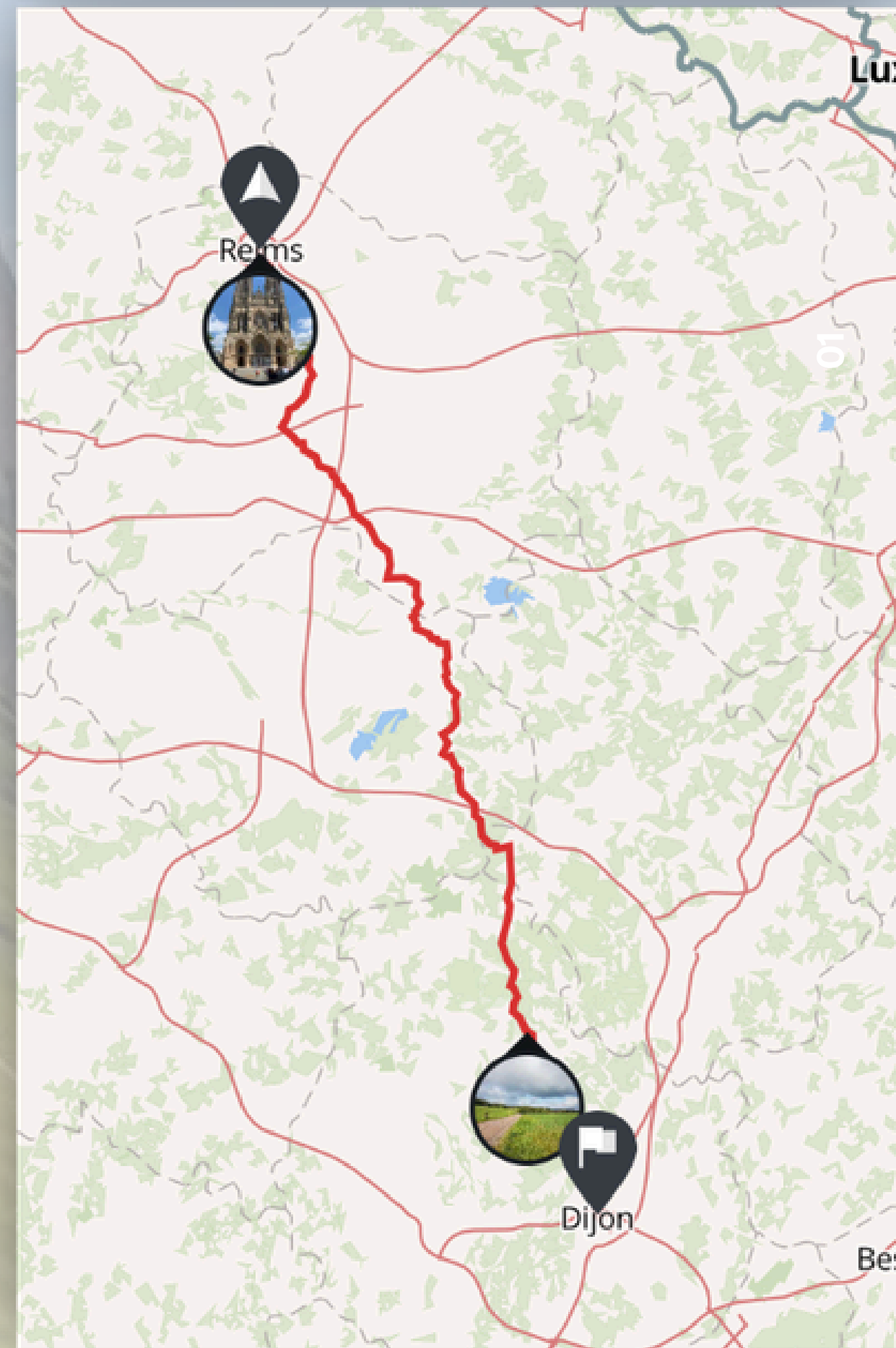
Distance: Approx. **180 miles**

- Ride through Burgundy and into Champagne
- Vineyard-lined backroads and peaceful French countryside
- Explore Reims Cathedral & historic centre
- Final night toast with real Champagne

Today we roll from one legendary wine region to another — swapping the deep reds of Burgundy for the bright sparkle of Champagne. The route is smooth and scenic, winding through sleepy villages, past sunflower fields and vineyards that stretch as far as the eye can see. It's a day for enjoying the flow of the road, stopping for a café crème in a local square, and soaking in the relaxed rhythm of rural France.

As we approach Reims, the land flattens slightly but the charm only grows. This city is steeped in history — French kings were crowned here, and the gothic cathedral is one of the finest in Europe. But we're also here for a different kind of royalty... Champagne.

Tonight's our final night together, so we raise a glass of the good stuff and toast the journey behind us. Six countries, countless mountain passes, endless curves, and friendships forged on the road — this is what it's all about.



REIMS TO FOLKESTONE

DAY 15

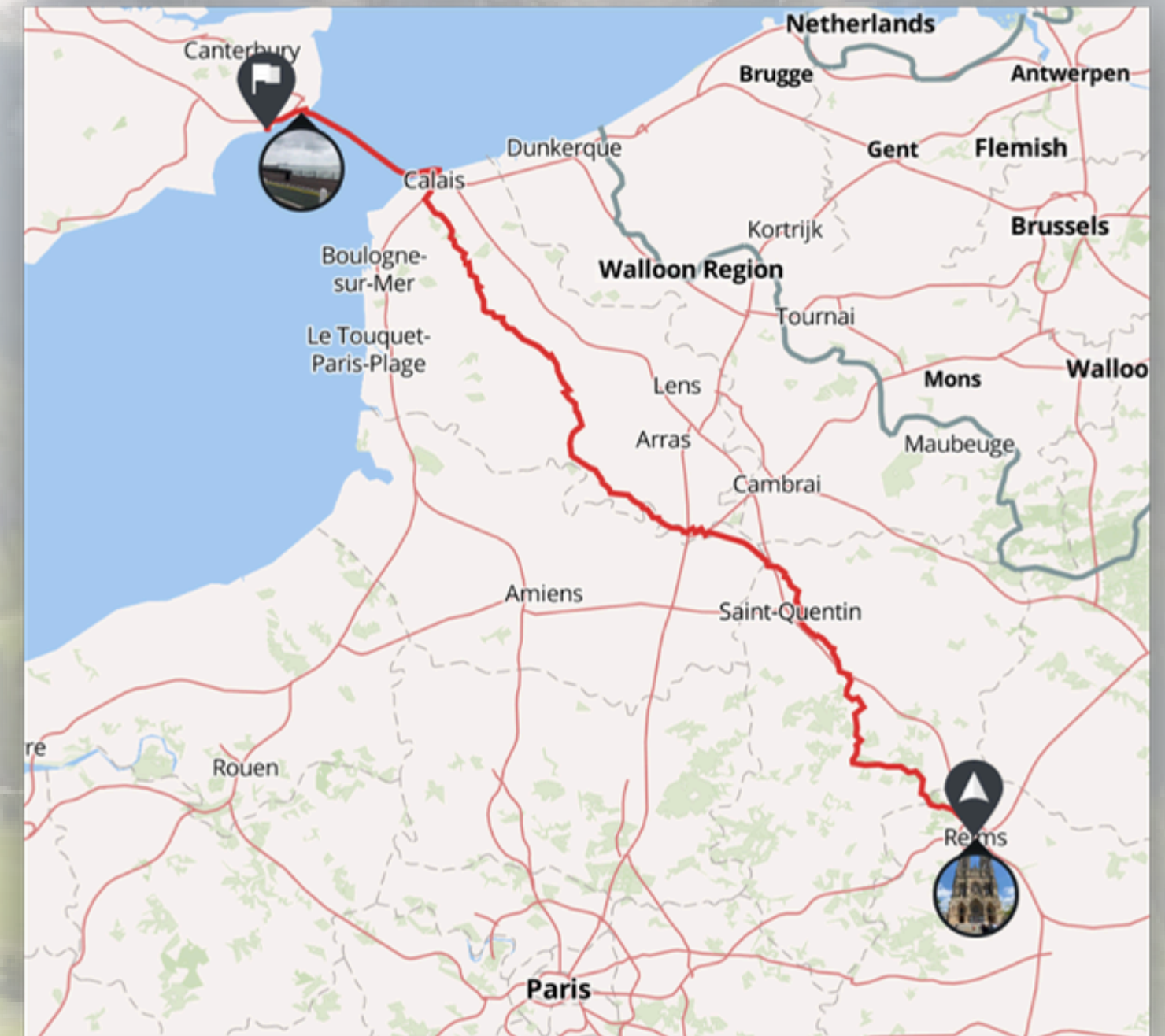
